Discussion about Airport policy change regarding Disabled Veteran parking per Florida Statute §316.1964(8)

Ms. Barnett, JAA Board Chair, was in attendance to speak about a recent policy change at Jacksonville International Airport related to disabled veteran parking. She explained that the airport is undergoing construction to expand the parking area, and that during the expansion disabled veterans with wheelchair designations are still permitted to park on site at no cost, but disabled veterans without wheelchair designations will be required to park in the economy lot and use shuttle service to get to the terminal.

There was discussion about the impact of the temporary policy change on veteran travelers. Council Member Miller asked about how the policy change was promoted and conveyed to inform the public.

Council Member Arias asked about the total number of parking spaces on site currently and how many are used by disabled veterans. He talked about the disparate treatment of disabled veterans in the name of efficiency.

Council Member Peluso said that there must be other options considered for disabled veteran parking, regardless of wheelchair designation.

Council Member Howland said that the parking on site for all disabled veterans needs to be restored immediately, he noted that Jacksonville is a veteran town that should prioritize heroes, and he asked if other airports that are under construction are implementing the same policy. Ms. Barnett said she will relay the council member's questions and concerns to the JAA Board, and report back regarding the questions asked by council members during this discussion.

Council Member Diamond provided a brief explanation of this bill as a clean up to his Accessory Dwelling Units bill from 2022.

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office explained the amendment. Approved unanimously.

Ms. Abney, Planning Department, described the changes made through this bill.

CP White explained the purpose of the bill and his support for First amendment rights.

Ms. Staffopoulos, OGC, talked about the history of the bill. There was a lengthy discussion related to sign size, free speech and safety and decorum during council meetings.

Council Member Carlucci offered a floor amendment to increase the allowable sign size to 2x2, but later in the discussion he withdrew the amendment.

Council Member Miller encouraged JSO involvement in assessing safe signage sizes.

Ms. Staffopoulos said that she will confer with JSO and report back with examples of different sized signs.

This item was deferred to permit more time to work out the specifics in the bill.

Ms. Carraher explained the Auditor's amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Johnson explained the purpose of the bill, which is to share the optional communication allowance with their ECAs. The bill also included an allowance amount increase. He noted that there has not been an increase in many years (2014).

There was discussion about the allowance amount and the preservation of text communications as public records. Chair Howland suggested sharing the allowance but waiting to address the proposed increase at the next budget time.

Council Member Boylan offered a floor amendment to remove the allowance increase (remain at \$100/month). Approved unanimously.

Council Member Johnson offered an amendment to the Boylan floor amendment to include the revised appropriation of \$12,500 to include funding for 9 months. Approved unanimously.

The floor amendment as amended was approved unanimously.

The amendments were rolled together as the Rules Committee amendment.
