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5 **ORDINANCE 2020-579-E**

6 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 307 (HISTORIC
7 PRESERVATION), *ORDINANCE CODE*; DESIGNATING THE
8 PEARSON RESIDENCE, LOCATED AT 1478 MCCONIHE
9 STREET, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 8, AS A LOCAL
10 LANDMARK, PURSUANT TO APPLICATION LM-20-02;
11 DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO
12 NOTIFY THE APPLICANT, THE PROPERTY OWNER, AND
13 THE PROPERTY APPRAISER OF THE LOCAL LANDMARK
14 DESIGNATION, AND TO RECORD THE LOCAL LANDMARK
15 DESIGNATION IN THE OFFICIAL RECORDS OF DUVAL
16 COUNTY; DIRECTING THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO
17 ENTER THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION ON THE
18 ZONING ATLAS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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20 **WHEREAS**, the Council enacted Chapter 307 (Historic
21 Preservation), *Ordinance Code*, and determined therein that the
22 preservation, protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of
23 landmarks, landmark sites and historic districts is a public
24 necessity because they have special historic, archaeological,
25 aesthetic or cultural interest and value; and

26 **WHEREAS**, the proposed local landmark, pursuant to Application
27 LM-20-02, **On File** with the Legislative Services Division, is the
28 Pearson Residence, located at 1478 McConihe Street, in Council
29 District 8; and

30 **WHEREAS**, Application LM-20-02 was filed by Roderick Pearson,

1 and the owner supports the proposed local landmark designation; and

2 **WHEREAS**, the Pearson Residence is a significant reminder of
3 the cultural and historical heritage of the City and is identified
4 with persons who significantly contributed to the development of
5 the City; and

6 **WHEREAS**, constructed in 1914, the residence is located in the
7 Durkeeville Community and serves as a significant reminder of the
8 cultural and historical heritage of the City for its direct
9 association with two key Civil Rights activist who contributed to
10 the end of segregation and inequalities in Jacksonville; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the residence was continuously owned and occupied by
12 the Pearson family from the early 1920s to the present and Rutledge
13 Henry Pearson and Lloyd Nash Pearson, Jr., sons of Lloyd Nash
14 Pearson, Sr. and Ruth Pearson were raised in the residence at 1478
15 McConihe Street and as adults lived there at different times; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Rutledge Henry Pearson, a teacher by profession and
17 well known for his leadership of the NAACP Youth Council during
18 their attempts to integrate the downtown lunch counters, is one of
19 the names most associated with the Civil Rights movement in
20 Jacksonville; and

21 **WHEREAS**, Lloyd Nash Pearson, Jr., was also a noted civil
22 rights activist in Jacksonville heading numerous voter registration
23 drives over many decades; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the Council finds that the Pearson Residence meets
25 two (2) of the seven (7) criteria required for local landmark
26 designation, as more particularly described in the Staff Report of
27 the Planning and Development Department (Staff Report), **On File**
28 with the Legislative Services Division; and

29 **WHEREAS**, on Augusts 26, 2020, the Jacksonville Historic
30 Preservation Commission reviewed and recommended approval of the
31 proposed local landmark designation; and

1 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 307 (Historic
2 Preservation), *Ordinance Code*, the Council has reviewed the
3 proposed local landmark designation, taking into consideration its
4 importance and historical and cultural value, as more fully set
5 forth in Application LM-20-04 and the Staff Report; and

6 **WHEREAS**, all public notice and public hearing requirements
7 have been met for designating the Pearson Residence as a local
8 landmark; and

9 **WHEREAS**, having met the requisite criteria, the Council finds
10 that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of
11 Jacksonville to designate the Pearson Residence as a local
12 landmark, in furtherance of historic preservation and protection;
13 now, therefore

14 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

15 **Section 1. Designation of Local Landmark.** Pursuant to
16 Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation), *Ordinance Code*, the Council
17 hereby designates the Pearson Residence, located at 1478 McConihe
18 Street, in Council District 8, as a local landmark.

19 **Section 2. Satisfaction of Requisite Criteria.** The
20 Council hereby finds that the Pearson Residence meets two (2) of
21 the seven (7) criteria for designation as a local landmark,
22 pursuant to Section 307.104(j), *Ordinance Code*, and adopts
23 Application LM-20-02 and the Staff Report in support of this
24 finding, both **On File** with the Legislative Services Division.

25 **Section 3. Notice and Recording.** Pursuant to Section
26 307.104(m), *Ordinance Code*, the Council hereby directs the Chief of
27 Legislative Services, as designee of the Council Secretary, to
28 notify the applicant, the property owner, and the Property
29 Appraiser of the local landmark designation, and to record the
30 local landmark designation in the official records of Duval County,
31 Florida.

1 **Section 4. Zoning Atlas.** Pursuant to Section 307.104(n),
2 *Ordinance Code*, the Council hereby directs the Zoning
3 Administrator, as designee of the Director of the Planning and
4 Development Department, to enter the local landmark designation on
5 the Zoning Atlas, in accordance with Section 656.203, *Ordinance*
6 *Code*.

7 **Section 5. Effective Date.** The enactment of this
8 ordinance shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of
9 the City Council and shall become effective upon signature by the
10 Council President and Council Secretary.
