A RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFETIME OF SERVICE AND MOURNING THEPASSING OF LIEUTENANT CHRISTOPHER MICHAEL CUNNINGHAM SR; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Christopher Michael Cunningham was born November 23, 1971, in Lincolnton, Georgia, the son of Carrie Lou and the late Zelma Cunningham, and the youngest of three siblings; and

WHEREAS, Chris Cunningham was a Navy Veteran, deployed on the USS George Washington in 1994, and received countless Navy achievement honors and medals including Southwest Asia Service Medal recognizing his exemplary service. Chris Cunningham was then stationed at NAS Cecil Field in Jacksonville, Florida, and when his Navy term ended in 1998 he transferred to the Naval Reserve where he remained on active call; and

WHEREAS, Lt. Chris Cunningham Sr. revered his family, and was joined in loving matrimony to Gwendolyn L. Prince-Cunningham in 2011. Family was the foundation of his life, and he treasured his time with his wife, sons, step-children, granddaughters, as well as numerous aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, his Navy family, his JSO family and closest friends; and

WHEREAS, after his discharge from the Navy, Lt. Cunningham Sr. graduated from Columbia College with a degree in Criminal Justice, and served the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office for years, and was promoted through the ranks achieving his

Lieutenant leadership over the Crime Scene Unit. At work Lt. Cunningham was known to be a man of compassion, with high expectations from his officers but who never asked more of them than he himself gave. He was known to treat the officers under his command as family, he also loved dancing and his kind nature kept his colleagues in his office smiling despite the frequent stress of the job; and
