RESOLUTION 2025-566-A

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE CHANGE OF COMMAND AT MARINE CORPS BLOUNT ISLAND COMMAND, HONORING COLONEL LUKE WATSON FOR HIS LEADERSHIP, AND WELCOMING COLONEL DAVID MERLES TO HIS NEW ROLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a change of command is a time-honored military tradition signifying the orderly transfer of authority and responsibility from one Commanding Officer to another, ensuring continuity of leadership and mission execution; and

WHEREAS, the base commander of Blount Island Command, located at the Marine Corps Support Facility Blount Island, serves as the senior officer responsible for directing operations, overseeing logistics, coordinating with civilian and military partners, and maintaining readiness in support of global Marine Corps missions; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Luke Watson relinquished command of Blount Island Command on July 2, 2025, following a tenure that included managing strategic pre-positioned equipment, maintaining exceptionally high readiness rates and audit compliance, supporting exercises across multiple countries, and completing infrastructure resilience initiatives; and

WHEREAS, on July 2, 2025, Colonel David A. Merles, originally from Cleveland, Ohio, a 1996 Marine Corps enlistee who was commissioned in 2002 after graduating from The Citadel, took command of Blount Island Command and Marine Corps Support Facility Blount

Island, relieving Colonel Watson during a ceremony aboard the USNS Sgt. William W. Seay; and

WHEREAS, Colonel Merles assumes leadership of over 1,200 service members, government civilians, and defense contractors, guiding the hub of the Marine Corps maritime pre-positioning programs that support expeditionary forces worldwide during exercises and contingency operations; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors Colonel Luke Watson for his dedicated service as Commander of Blount Island Command and thanks him for his leadership in managing strategic readiness, infrastructure resilience, and global pre-positioning efforts, and congratulates Colonel David Merles on assuming command, and welcomes him in his new capacity, expressing confidence in his leadership and his commitment to sustaining Blount Island's critical mission in support of the Marine Corps.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
