4 **ORDINANCE 2019-482**

5 AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF DR.  
6 HUSON GILBERSTADT, AS A MEMBER OF THE OPIOID  
7 ABUSE PREVENTION COMMITTEE, AS A MEDICAL  
8 PROFESSIONAL, EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT  
9 REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 84.202,  
10 ORDINANCE CODE, FOR AN INITIAL TERM ENDING  
11 SEPTEMBER 30, 2022; ESTABLISHING SUBSTANTIAL  
12 BUSINESS INTEREST IN DUVAL COUNTY, PURSUANT TO  
13 SECTION 50.102 (B) (RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT),  
14 ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR WAIVER OF  
15 SECTION 50.102 (C) (MEMBERS OF BOARDS AND  
16 COMMISSIONS), ORDINANCE CODE, AS TO THE  
17 REQUIREMENT THAT THE BILL SPONSOR APPEAR  
18 BEFORE THE RULES COMMITTEE AT A SEPARATE  
19 MEETING AND PRIOR TO THE APPEARANCE OF THE  
20 APPOINTEE, TO ESTABLISH AND DEBATE THE  
21 REQUIREMENTS OF THE SUBSTANTIAL BUSINESS  
22 CONTRIBUTION OF THE APPOINTEE; REQUESTING  
23 EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING  
24 AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

26 **WHEREAS**, Ordinance 2019-56-E enacted March 26, 2019, created  
27 the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee; and

28 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor shall appoint nine members of the Opioid  
29 Abuse Prevention Committee within various categories as provided by  
30 Section 84.202, Ordinance Code; and

31 **WHEREAS**, on May 28, 2019, Resolution 2019-412 was introduced

1 to have Dr. Gilberstadt appointed to the Opioid Abuse Prevention  
2 Committee, but listed Dr. Gilberstadt as a Duval County resident;  
3 and

4 **WHEREAS**, on June 18, 2019, the Rules Committee interviewed Dr.  
5 Gilberstadt and approved his appointment resolution 2019-412  
6 unanimously, and placed the Resolution on the Council agenda to be  
7 considered at the June 25, 2019 regular Council meeting; and

8 **WHEREAS**, in order to correct Dr. Gilberstadt's county of  
9 residence and to establish substantial economic business interest  
10 in Duval County, Resolution 2019-412 is being withdrawn and this  
11 legislation is being filed to avoid confusing and delay of the  
12 appointment; now therefore

13 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

14 **Section 1. Appointment.** The Council hereby confirms the  
15 Mayor's appointment of Dr. Huson Gilberstadt, a Nassau County  
16 resident with substantial economic business interests in Duval  
17 County, to the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee, as a Medical  
18 Professional, Emergency Department representative, in accordance  
19 with Section 84.202, *Ordinance Code*, for an initial term expiring  
20 September 30, 2022.

21 **Section 2. A Non-Resident of Duval County with**  
22 **substantial economic business interests in Duval County.** Section  
23 50.102 (Members of boards and commissions), *Ordinance Code*,  
24 requires Board and Commission members be either a Duval County  
25 resident or individuals with substantial economic business  
26 interests in Duval County. Dr. Gilberstadt has substantial business  
27 interests in Duval County. Dr. Gilberstadt was born and raised in  
28 Jacksonville. Since 2016, Dr. Gilberstadt has been serving as the  
29 Chief Clinical Officer for the Ascension Florida market.  
30 Previously, Dr. Gilberstadt served in the dual role as Chief  
31 Clinical Officer for St. Vincent's Healthcare and President of St.


1 Vincent's Riverside. Dr. Gilberstadt has also served as Chief  
2 Medical Officer of St. Vincent's Riverside Acute Care Division. Dr.  
3 Gilberstadt has also been a physician advisor at the three St.  
4 Vincent locates and worked for the Emergency Medical Specialists of  
5 Jacksonville.

6 **Section 3. Waiver of Section 50.102 (c) (Members of**  
7 **boards and commissions), Ordinance Code.** Section 50.102 (c)  
8 (Members of boards and commissions), 50 (Organization of Boards and  
9 Commissions), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived as to the  
10 requirement that the bill sponsor appear before the Rules Committee  
11 at a meeting separate and prior to the appearance of the appointee,  
12 to establish and debate the requirements of the substantial  
13 business contribution of the appointee. A waiver is required  
14 because the appointee appeared prior to the discussion of the  
15 substantial business interest and that the substantial business  
16 interest is being established herein.

17 **Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction**  
18 **pursuant to Council Rule 4.901.** Emergency passage of this  
19 legislation is requested upon introduction. The nature of the  
20 emergency is that the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee would like  
21 to start meeting as soon as possible, and Dr. Gilberstadt has  
22 already been interviewed by the Rules Committee, and his  
23 appointment will add to the Committee to avoid potential loss of  
24 quorum.

25 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become  
26 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
27 without the Mayor's signature.

**Bill Summary:** This bill confirms the Mayor's appointment of Dr. Huson Gilberstadt, as a member of the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee, as a Medical Professional, Emergency Department Representative for an initial term ending September 30, 2022.

**Background Information:** Chapter 84, Part 2, *Ordinance Code*, establishes the Opioid Abuse Prevention Committee. Sec. 84.202, *Ordinance Code*, provides that the Committee shall consist of nine members to be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation of the Council.

Dr. Gilberstadt is the Chief Clinical Officer for the Ascension Florida Marketplace. Previously, Dr. Gilberstadt was in the dual role of Chief Clinical Officer for St. Vincent's HealthCare and President of St. Vincent's Riverside. He resides within Duval County.
