- The nature of the emergency is that traffic control at the intersection is needed to address safety concerns until the intersection improvements are completed

Edward Linsky explained the nature of the emergency, with traffic concerns at the intersection of Wells Creek Parkway and Phillips Highway posing an immediate safety concerns for the residents of the adjacent neighborhood.

CM Peluso stated his support for the bill, noting that he had discussed the potential of the homeowners' association off-setting some of the bill's cost but understood that this traffic situation was a legitimate safety concern.

CM Arias gave some background on the bill. This bill is meant as a temporary solution to the traffic problem; the traffic light that should serve as a permanent solution will not be installed until December 2024. He clarified that this bill would hire off-duty police officers rather than mandating overtime. The officers will direct traffic during school year mornings at the request of the community.

CM Carlucci requested to be added as a co-sponsor and stated that he believes that CM Arias did the right thing in finding an immediate solution to a pressing need.

Ellis Burns and Bill Clement of JSO spoke on the bill, stating that they needed to clarify several issues, such as IRS salary implications of hiring off-duty officers, with the Office of the General Counsel before the bill's passage.

Mr. Linsky explained the amendment, with the amendment clarifying that JSO would be hiring off-duty officers through Extra Duty Solutions. The emergency was unanimously approved by the Committee. The amendment was unanimously approved by the Committee.

CM Clark-Murray asked whether these issues regarding contracting off-duty officers could result in the delay of the bill, and Mr. Lisnky responded that these issues should be resolved by Tuesday's meeting.

Public Comment:

Carnell Oliver spoke on bill 2023-0867 appropriating an EPA grant to provide funding for air-quality-monitoring equipment. He requested that a representative from JEA report to the Council on its efforts to reduce pollution and transfer to clean energy. He noted that various branches and levels of government need to be on the same page.
