5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$310,713.50 FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY TO 6 7 THE MENTAL HEALTH OFFENDER PROGRAM ("MHOP") TO 8 PAY FOR CONTRACTUAL SERVICES BY I.M. SULZBACHER 9 CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. ("SULZBACHER") FOR THE CONTINUED OPERATION OF A JAIL DIVERSION 10 PROGRAM FOR MENTALLY ILL OFFENDERS THROUGH THE 11 MHOP; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER TO SEPTEMBER 30, 12 2025; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR 13 HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO 14 15 EXECUTE AND DELIVER A SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND I.M. SULZBACHER 16 CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, INC. FOR THE PROVISION 17 18 OF SERVICES FOR THE MHOP; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH 19 20 A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 21 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), 22 ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH SULZBACHER; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE 23 GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION; 24 25 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,
within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

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8 The funding above represents an appropriation of 9 \$310,713.50 from the Council President's Designated 10 Contingency to procure contractual services from I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. ("Sulzbacher") 11 for the continued operation of a jail diversion program 12 for mentally ill offenders through the Mental Health 13 Offender Program ("MHOP"). 14

15 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 16 Section 1 is to provide City funds to procure contractual services 17 from I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. for the continued 18 operation of a jail diversion program for mentally ill offenders 19 through the Mental Health Offender Program.

20 Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall 21 not lapse but shall carryover to September 30, 2025.

22 Approval and Authorization to Execute. There is Section 4. 23 hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation 24 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, a Services 25 Contract between the City of Jacksonville and I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., subject to the terms, conditions and budget 26 outlined in **Exhibit 2**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by 27 28 this reference, in a not-to-exceed amount of \$310,713.50 for a term 29 commencing on July 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025, for the 30 continued provision of services for the Mental Health Offender 31 Program, and all other contracts and documents, including extensions,

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renewals and amendments to the agreement, and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the General Counsel, or his designee, and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

7 Section 5. Waiver of Section 118.107, Ordinance Code, to 8 Allow for a Direct Contract with I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the 9 Homeless, Inc. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to 10 receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, 11 are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract between I.M. 12 Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., and the City of Jacksonville 13 for Sulzbacher's continued oversight and management of the jail 14 15 diversion program for mentally ill offenders through the MHOP. This waiver is justified because Sulzbacher has successfully operated the 16 17 jail diversion program since the inception of the MHOP as a nine-month 18 pilot project.

19 Section 6. Oversight. The Grants and Contract Compliance 20 Division of the Finance Department shall oversee the project described 21 herein.

22 Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 23 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 24 without the Mayor's signature.
