AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE; NAMING AN EXISTING PRIVATE ROAD EXTENDING FROM HECKSCHER DRIVE TO A DEAD END IN COUNCIL DISTRICT TO "J.D. THOMPSON RECOGNIZING THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF J.D. THOMPSON; WAIVING THE REQUIREMENT OF CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING POLICY THAT THE HONOREE BE DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND COORDINATION VARIOUS CITY DEPARTMENTS AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on July 17, 1967, JEA linemen, J. D. Thompson and Randall Champion, were working on two separate utility poles on West 26th Street in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Champion accidentally contacted power lines which caused 2,400 volts of direct electricity to his body; and

WHEREAS, such extensive amount of electrical power rendered Mr. Champion unconscious and suspended by his safety harness more than 20 feet off the ground; and

WHEREAS, fellow lineman, J.D. Thompson, quickly climbed down the utility pole he was working on a few hundred feet away and ran toward and climbed up Mr. Champion's utility pole to save his friend and co-worker; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Thompson administered mouth-to-mouth resuscitation which, successfully, awakened Mr. Champion. Next, Mr. Thompson unhooked Mr. Champion's safety harness and helped lower him safely to the ground below; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council desires to name an existing private street extending from Heckscher Drive in Council District 2 to "J.D. Thompson Street" in honor of J.D. Thompson, for his heroic rescue of co-worker, Randall Champion; and

WHEREAS, Section 745.106 (a), Ordinance Code, requires the Planning and Development Department to "...establish and maintain, in conjunction with the files of public street names, a registry of names of private streets and Unnamed Shared Accessways in the City..."; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Subsection 745.106 (c), Ordinance Code, "[e]xisting private streets or Unnamed Shared Accessways may be named in accordance with the requirements and procedures set forth in the Addressing and Street Naming Policy..."; and

WHEREAS, the City Addressing and Street Naming Policy requires that "...[t]he individual whose name is used must have been deceased for a period of no less than 5 years"; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds it appropriate to name an existing private street extending from Heckscher Drive in Council District 2 to "J.D. Thompson Street"; and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Existing private street named as "J.D. Thompson Street." An existing private street extending from Heckscher Drive in Council District 2 is hereby named as "J.D. Thompson Street" by

which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter known and designated. A copy of the map of "J.D. Thompson Street" is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Waiver of City of Jacksonville Addressing and Street Naming Policy. The City of Jacksonville Addressing and Street Naming Policy, requiring that the honoree be deceased for at least five years is hereby waived because the Council desires to recognize the heroic contributions of J.D. Thompson made to the City of Jacksonville more than 50 years ago which are long overdue.

to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief of Legislative Services is requested to send a copy of this legislation, once enacted, to the Addressing Section of the Planning and Development Department for processing, implementation, and coordination with 911 Emergency, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, the Post Office, the Traffic Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, and other affected agencies and organizations.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
