The Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) will support efforts to conduct energy audits and weatherization repairs that lower energy bills for up to 110 low-income residents in partnership with JEA and community-based organizations through the Restore, Repair and Resiliency (R3) program. Services will include blower door tests to measure air that leaks out of the home, installation of a data monitoring system to measure climate inside the home, and provide for the replacement of HVAC units, doors, insulation, and energy efficient lightbulbs. The program will focus on low-income households in Jacksonville's Historic Eastside, then expand city-wide. These funds were awarded to the City of Jacksonville by the U.S. Department of Energy to implement this program and JEA is considered a sub-recipient and is responsible for seeing this program to completion. This program is currently fully funded by federal dollars. JEA has agreed to provide these updates to low-income, single-family, owner-occupied homes within 24 months (two years) as required by the grant requirements. Reporting requirements will be handled by JEA staff with back-up support by Housing and Community Development staff. Funding will be provided on an reimbursement basis, by COJ, as expenditures are approved for payout. No reimbursement requests can be made until this legislation is passed, creating this program, as any expense must be made after the effective date of the legislation.
