Council Member Clark-Murray talked about the bill and the MLK parade.

Council Member Johnson said he would like the Office of Sports and Entertainment to be involved with the planning/implementation of the parade, to lend their expertise. He offered a floor amendment to add a provision that the Office of Sports and Entertainment will provide assistance to the Foundation in the implementation of the parade with the level of assistance to be determined by the Sports and Entertainment Officer. Approved unanimously and rolled together with the Auditor's amendment.

Council Member Freeman suggested providing City assets (bleachers etc.) instead of cash funding for the event. Ms. Staffopoulos said there may be potential issues with procurement, or if there are already existing contracts with vendors.

Council Member Clark-Murray said that Council Member Freeman's idea could possibly be incorporated into next year's parade, but this year's parade is well past the planning stages already since it occurs in January.

Ms. Carraher explained the amendment and emergency. Both were approved unanimously. Arimus Wells, Planning Department, explained the purpose of the bill to streamline the REHAB application process and guidelines.

NCSPHS AMENDMENT

- 1. Pg. 2, lines 20-21: strike "Upon Introduction"
- 2. Attach revised Exhibits 1 and 2 (Revised REHAB Guidelines) to a) clarify that grants will be subject to repayment in the event of default, sale, or transfer of the property within five years of disbursement and b) require that the applicant provide a notarized affidavit attesting that they are current on all taxes
- The nature of the emergency is that applications have been submitted and the administrators desire to process them under the revised guidelines in a timely manner
- Proposed changes to the guidelines include:
- a) Clarify that work done after an application is submitted but prior to final grant approval may be eligible for reimbursement, but reimbursement is not guaranteed
- b) Change completion deadline for projects from 5 years to 3 years from date of grant approval
- c) Change limit on grant amount from 40% of total development costs to 50% of total construction costs (acquisition cost/market value of property no longer counts toward total)
- d) Remove requirement for applicant to provide 3-year pro forma financial statements
- e) Remove requirement for applicant to provide tax returns for the most recent two years
- f) Remove requirement for applicant to be current on income taxes
- g) Remove requirement that a certificate of occupancy be issued prior to distribution of grant funds
- h) Clarify that Local Landmark status must be obtained prior to distribution of grant funds (if the structure was not already designated a contributing structure to a historic district)
- i) Require an annual report from the property owner or applicant for the five years following disbursement of grant funds
