AN ORDINANCE CLOSING AND ABANDONING AND/OR DISCLAIMING A PORTION OF PHYLLIS STREET, A PLATTED, OPENED AND IMPROVED RIGHT-OF-WAY IN RIVERSIDE GARDENS, AS RECORDED AND ESTABLISHED IN PLAT BOOK 3, PAGE 67, DATED MARCH 23, 1910, THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF ΙN DUVAL FLORIDA, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 9, AT THE REQUEST STEVEN N. BACALIS (THE "APPLICANT") CONSOLIDATE, ENCLOSE AND GATE HIS ABUTTING BUSINESS PROPERTIES KNOWN AS 4757 PHYLLIS ST LLC, 440 EDGEWOOD LLC, AND 4735 PHYLLIS STREET LLC (THE "ABUTTING PROPERTIES"), SUBJECT TO RESERVATION UNTO THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ("CITY") AND JEA OF EASEMENTS OVER THE RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR INGRESS AND EGRESS AND FOR ALL UTILITIES; PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE REAL ESTATE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Closure and Abandonment. A portion of Phyllis Street, a platted, opened and improved right-of-way in Riverside Gardens, as recorded and established in Plat Book 3, Page 67, dated

March 23, 1910, in the Public Records of Duval County, Florida (the "Plat"), and located in Council District 9, a description of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby closed and abandoned and/or disclaimed as a right-of-way at the request of Steven N. Bacalis (the "Applicant"); provided, however, there is hereby reserved unto the City of Jacksonville and JEA perpetual unobstructed easements on, over, across, under and through the closed portion of the right-of-way for ingress and egress and for all utilities, including, but not limited to, water, sewer, electric and drainage.

Section 2. Purpose. The Applicant is requesting the closure to consolidate, enclose and gate the Abutting Properties, subject to the conditions set forth herein. All of the adjacent property and underlying right-of-way is owned by the Applicant inclusive of the section of the Phyllis Street right-of-way lying to the east of the portion to be abandoned pursuant to this legislation which was previously abandoned. The Applicant has paid a \$2,091.00 closure application processing fee. This closure request was reviewed and approved by the various city, state, municipal and utility agencies that might have an interest in the right-of-way and there were no objections to the Applicant's request.

Section 3. Hold Harmless Covenants. The closure and abandonment by the City of its interests in the right-of-way is subject to Applicant's execution and delivery to the City of the hold harmless covenants in substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. Accordingly, the closure and abandonment of the right-of-way shall not be recorded in the Public Records until execution and delivery to the City by the Applicant of the required hold harmless covenants.
