Council Member Howland proposed a substitute that increases the tax rebate amount and decreases the cash grant. He explained that the with this change, the ROI increases from 1.01 to 1.17.

Council Member Carlucci asked Mr. Randolph, OED, if he supports the substitute. Mr. Randolph expressed support. Council Member Miller asked how many similar development agreements the City has done, and how many more are in the hopper.

Mr. Randolph said he is aware of a few in recent years and said there are no other similar deals in the works currently.

- 1. Increase the REV Grant from a \$10 million 75% grant to a \$16 million 90% grant

He listed some statistics from JSO as related to enforcing the prohibition on public camping: since October 1st JSO has issued 272 warnings, made 16 arrests, issued 11 notices to appear, and connected 41 individuals with the Homeward Bound program that pays for transportation for unhoused individuals to their home city or location with relatives.

Council Member Freeman spoke about the impact of the homeless population on downtown businesses. He said those experiencing homelessness gather downtown due to the proximity to resources and food programs.

Council Member Howland talked about shelter capacity and barriers to shelter entry. Mr. Judd, Trinity Rescue Mission, said the barriers to entry for that shelter are low.
