Eugene "Gene" Frenette has enjoyed a distinguished journalism career spanning over five decades, including 44 years dedicated to chronicling sports in Jacksonville, beginning with his role at the Jacksonville Journal in 1981, and subsequently at the Florida Times-Union following the merger of the two newspapers in 1983; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Frenette's dedication to his craft was significantly supported by his wife of 34 years, Dot Frenette, whose encouragement and partnership provided a foundation throughout his long and impactful career, reflecting a deep personal commitment to family and community; and

WHEREAS, the warmth, humor, and genuine care Mr. Frenette exhibited in both his professional and personal interactions endeared him greatly to the Jacksonville community, establishing him as not only an iconic sports journalist but also a cherished member of the community; and

WHEREAS, upon his retirement in May 2025, Gene Frenette leaves a lasting legacy of excellence in journalism and dedicated public service, having earned a permanent and cherished place in the fabric of Jacksonville's sports history and setting a benchmark for future generations; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council honors and commends Gene Frenette for his 44 years of distinguished local journalism. The City Council expresses its deepest appreciation for Mr. Frenette's decades of dedicated service, recognizing the positive and lasting influence his work has had on Jacksonville's sports community and civic life.
