Explanation of Appropriation - The funding above is being (C) appropriated (\$200,000 from the Social Justice and Community Investment Special Committee Contingency and \$200,000 from the Office of the Sheriff Pre-Trial Operations - Health Services) to provide funding for a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders to be managed by the Sulzbacher Center (\$350,000) and to hire a Mental Health Initiative Jail Coordinator ("Coordinator"), to be housed in the court system, to oversee the MHOP (\$50,000).

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Mental Health Offender Program (MHOP), which is a jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders, services and a program coordinator, as more

fully described in **Exhibit 2** attached hereto. The MHOP operational services will be managed by the Sulzbacher Center. The Mental Health Initiative Jail Coordinator will be managed by the court system.

Agreement approved and execution authorized. Section 3. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., in substantially the form as attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**, and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement"). The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of the Sulzbacher Center as stated in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City and any other nonsubstantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the professional services of the Sulzbacher Center, to manage the jail diversion program for mentally ill misdemeanor offenders.

Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Agreement approved and execution authorized. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, the Funding Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts of Florida, in substantially the form as attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 4, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 4, Revised Agmt, November 30, 2020 - NCSPHS", incorporated herein by this reference (the "Agreement") to provide for a Mental Health Initiative Coordinator. The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or liability of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties obligations of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Courts of Florida as stated in the Agreement, and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel. Section 7. Oversight. The Mayor is requested to appoint the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance to oversee the project in Section 2 above and to ensure compliance with all other appropriate laws.

Section 8. Requesting cycle emergency one pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency this legislation is requested. The nature of the passage of emergency is that mental health needs are great, and the community will be well served by not delaying these needed mental health services.

Section 9. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
