Council Member Carlucci invited Charles Griggs to comment; he said the administration has no objections.

Council Member Boylan said the Council wants to work with the administration with goodwill. Council Member Howland disagreed that the Council shouldn't have an equal voice with the strong mayor and said he checked with JSO and they said they're not too busy to find a member to participate. He suggested an amendment to make all appointees to be confirmed by the Council.

Council Member Carlucci moved the amendment to the substitute on behalf of Howland; Council Member Carlucci asked for clarification of the Howland amendment – Howland said all 4 individual recommendations from JSO, State Attorney, Chief Judge, and School Superintendent and the 3 council appointments are nominations to be approved by the council and the chair of the board shall be elected by the membership, not appointed by the Mayor.

Council Member Carlucci asked who the chair was originally intended to be – Carla Lopera said the Mayor appoints the Chair for the first 2 years then the body elects their own. Council Member Carlucci said he disagrees that the Mayor doesn't get to appoint the first chair – she ran on a Journey platform and that should be respected by letting her appoint the first chair.

Council Member Carlucci moved, 2nd Johnson to amend the Howland amendment to leave the first chair appointed by the mayor for 2 years.

Council Member Freeman asked for the difference between "recommendation" vs. "appointment" – Ms. Lopera said it's the degree of discretion of the Mayor - she doesn't have to take a recommendation and submit that name for appointment.

Council Member Freeman asked how Paul Perez got to be chair of the Journey the last time – Charles Griggs said he was appointed by the Mayor.

Council Member Freeman said he would like to know who the Mayor is considering as candidates for the position of Chair, it's important in the current atmosphere of political drama to know who she's considering.

Council Member Johnson asked if all appointments come to council for approval – Mr. Peterson said the appointment of a Chair is not usually subject to council approval. Ms. Lopera said the Mayor could appoint any of the members as the chair and it could be someone other than one of her appointees. Council Member Johnson asked how the administration feels about these changes. Mr. Griggs said they were OK with the changes made in NSCPHS this morning. Council Member Johnson suggested finding a better word than "appointee" since they aren't appointed until after Council confirms.

Council Member Howland said his intent is to prevent the Mayor from not submitting the recommendation of the 4 appointing officials and replacing them with her own preferences. Council Member Boylan said that's not right – if the Mayor didn't forward an appointee for consideration, then the appointing authority would be asked to submit another. Council Member Freeman asked if the chair would be 1 of the 11 members and have been approved by council – Ms. Lopera said that is correct. The Carlucci amendment was approved unanimously

Council Member Boylan asked for clarification of what happens if the mayor declines to appoint a recommendation from 1 of the 4 officials.
