7 A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER TO
8 BE SICKLE CELL DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH IN
9 JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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11 **WHEREAS**, September is National Sickle Cell Awareness Month; and

12 **WHEREAS**, sickle cell anemia is an inherited blood disorder that
13 mostly affects people of African ancestry, but also occurs in other
14 ethnic groups, including people who are of Mediterranean and Middle
15 Eastern descent; and

16 **WHEREAS**, sickle cell disease affects approximately 100,000
17 Americans, occurring in about 1 out of every 16,300 Hispanic American
18 births and in about 1 out of every 365 Black or African American
19 births, where about 1 in 13 Black or African American babies is born
20 with sickle cell trait; and

21 **WHEREAS**, sickle cell disease is a genetic condition that is
22 present at birth, and is inherited when a child receives two genes,
23 one from each parent, that code for abnormal hemoglobin and can lead
24 to chronic anemia, episodes of debilitating pain and damage to vital
25 organs; and

26 **WHEREAS**, while the only therapy approved by the Food and Drug
27 Administration that may be able to cure sickle cell disease is a bone
28 marrow or stem cell transplant from a close donor match; however,
29 early identification of a child with sickle cell disease coupled with
30 antibiotic prophylaxis by 3 months of age and early intervention
31 services helps those with sickle cell disease while researchers

1 continue to search for a cure; now therefore

2 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

3 **Section 1.** The City Council hereby declares the month of
4 September to be Sickle Cell Disease Awareness Month in Jacksonville
5 and encourages all citizens to become educated about this disease,
6 its impact on those who suffer from it, the costs it imposes on
7 society at large, and the work being done to find a permanent cure.

8 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
9 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
10 without the Mayor's signature.
