Holly King spoke in favor of the bill and expressed concern that the bill might be withdrawn given a conversation that she had recently had with Renee Hunter of the Real Estate Department. She claimed that the 12 feet of disclaimed right-of-way as proposed in the bill would not block the abutting owner's access to their property, and she offered to provide documentation to prove this point.

Renee Hunter clarified that the bill is not currently being withdrawn but rather deferred.

Eric King reiterated Holly King's statements that the abutting property owner's access to their property would not be hindered by the disclaiming of a portion of the right-of-way and added that the remaining right-of-way would be wider than the two-lane road that served as the main point of access. He stated that he has added gravel to the road to improve the right-of-way while the abutting property owner has degraded the property with unregistered tractors and heavy machinery.

Donna Troupe also spoke in favor of the bill, observing that the abutting property owner has driven semi-trucks down this right-of-way and has started and left unsupervised fires on his property, which is what prompted the need for emergency vehicles.

CM Gay clarified that there were two other property owners who used this right-of-way for access to their properties, and he stated that the Council should consider future implications of disclaiming portions of right-of-way. He said that the bill is being deferred so he can hear both sides of this argument and come to a conclusion based on evidence presented.
