RESOLUTION 2025-568-A

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE UNITED STATES COAST GUARD SECTOR JACKSONVILLE CHANGE OF COMMAND, HONORING CAPTAIN JANET D. ESPINO-YOUNG FOR HER LEADERSHIP, AND WELCOMING CAPTAIN JASON ALEKSAK TO HIS NEW ROLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville held a Change of Command ceremony in July 2025 at the Jacksonville Public Library, a time-honored tradition in military leadership that formally acknowledges the transfer of authority and responsibility from one commanding officer to another; and
