Bill Summary: This bill appropriates \$31,070.15 in grant funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), funded through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program and approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management, for the purchase and installation of seven permanent generators at seven stormwater pump station locations throughout Duval County. The ordinance authorizes the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary to execute Modification Number Two to Subgrant Agreement Contract No. H0543. The bill amends the 2025-2029 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program adopted by Ordinance 2024-505-E to add the project titled "Stormwater Pump Stations Generators."

Background Information: The purpose of this legislation is to appropriate \$31,070.15 in grant funding awarded through FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to support the purchase and installation of seven permanent generators at stormwater pump stations in Duval County. The locations include Hillman Drive (Treetop Estates), Myrtle Avenue, Hilly Road (Trout River), Bradley Road, Jessie Street, McGirts Creek Park (Lew Brantley), and Sandalwood Canal. The project will be overseen by the Department of Public Works, Engineering and Construction Management Division. The purpose of the generators is to reduce or mitigate damage caused by severe weather or other hazards. The City's match requirements have been met.

Policy Impact Area: Emergency infrastructure

Fiscal Impact: This bill appropriates \$31,070.15 in grant funds. No local match required.
