COUNCIL RULE 4.505 DISRUPTION OF MEETING

Any person who disrupts a regular meeting of the City Council, standing committees, special or select committees, sub-committees or any other public meeting presided over by a City Council Member may be forthwith barred, removed, or otherwise ejected, in the discretion of the presiding officer, from further attendance at that meeting. If necessary, due to the nature of the disruption, the audience may be cleared from the Council Chambers or meeting location in the discretion of the presiding officer.

Any person who refuses to leave the City Council Chamber may be subject to arrest.

Disruption of a meeting includes the following types of behaviors:

- 1) Any form of political campaigning or electioneering regarding a specific candidate or group of candidates in City elections;
- 2) Impeding the orderly progress of the meeting by shouting, yelling, whistling, chanting, singing, dancing, clapping, foot stomping, snapping fingers, cheering, jeering, using artificial noise makers or musical instruments, waving signs of any size, or engaging in any other display of excessive noise, sounds, or movement;
- 3) Displaying or waving signs of any sort, except where used to support the speaker's presentation at the podium, and only where the sign is 21 inches by 21 inches or smaller in size and cannot be displayed in a manner which unreasonably obstructs the view of the dais for any member of the audience, regardless of message;
- 4) Audible noise from cellphones or other electronic devices;
- 5) Consumption of alcohol or controlled substances;
- 6) Making vulgar or offensive remarks or gestures, or using threatening language or gestures, including but not limited to pantomiming discharging a firearm, choking, or throat-cutting;
- 7) Refusing to stop speaking when his or her time has expired or is otherwise directed by the presiding officer to do so due to disruptive behavior as described herein;
- 8) Returning to the meeting after having been removed or ejected, or attempting to do so.

Ms. Carraher explained the amendment. The amendment passed via a voice vote.

Council Member Freeman noted another amendment was expected and asked for clarification. Dylan Reingold, Office of General Counsel, explained the amendment would remove outdated references to a director and division, allow JEA to assess civil penalties, and preserve the City's enforcement mechanisms.

Council Member Salem confirmed if the language had been shared with JEA. Christine Valliere, Office of General Counsel for JEA, confirmed JEA's agreement and explained the ordinance updates are needed for the industrial pretreatment program, compliance with the Clean Water Act, and new potable reuse rules. She described JEA's reuse project and local pollutant limits approved by FDEP.

Carla Lopera, Office of General Counsel, explained the amendment. Council Member Boylan confirmed JEA's supervisory role and that industrial users must pretreat wastewater. Ms. Valliere agreed.

Ms. Carraher explained the amendment. The amendment passed via a voice vote. Council Member Salem said the issue reflected a government failure predating Ms. Hernandez and supported the bill. Council Member Freeman stated he sponsored the original legislation, explained it was intended as a one-year incubator but was extended to four years, creating problems. He questioned eligibility for PSGs. Ms. Hernandez said all groups were eligible, only one applied and was disqualified and the RFP design caused compliance issues. Ms. Della Sellers, Girls of Virtue, spoke, stating her group was told informally they would not qualify and found the process burdensome. Council Member Freeman concluded the original intent was short-term support with case management not long-term funding and supported the bill to correct past failures.
