## ORDINANCE 2025-782

AN ORDINANCE HONORING THE LEGACY AND BRAVE SERVICE OF FIREFIGHTER HENRY BRADLEY TO THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; NAMING THE CITY-OWNED BUILDING LOCATED AT 12 CATHERINE STREET, JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA, IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 7, PURSUANT TO SECTION 122.105 (PUBLIC BUILDINGS, PUBLIC FACILITIES AND PUBLIC PARKS NAMING AND RENAMING PROCEDURES), ORDINANCE CODE, TO BE KNOWN AS THE "HENRY BRADLEY FIREFIGHTERS MUSEUM"; WAIVING THE TIMELINE ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 122.105 (PUBLIC BUILDINGS, PUBLIC FACILITIES AND PUBLIC PARK NAMING AND RENAMING PROCEDURES), ORDINANCE CODE, PERTAINING TO THE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION FROM THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION SECTION OF THE COMMUNITY PLANNING DIVISION OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE JACKSONVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION FOR NAMING OF A CITY-OWNED BUILDING; RENAMING A ROADWAY CURRENTLY IDENTIFIED AS "CATHERINE STREET" TO "HENRY BRADLEY PLACE" IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 7 PURSUANT TO SECTION 745.105 (PUBLIC STREET NAME CHANGES), ORDINANCE CODE, ; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AND TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DIVISIONS, FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND COORDINATION WITH 911

EMERGENCY, THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, THE U.S. POSTAL SERVICE, AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS PERTAINING TO THE ROAD RENAMING; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Henry Bradley worked as a volunteer firefighter in the 1800s until December 16, 1885, when he perished while battling a fierce fire during which a wall collapsed on him; and

WHEREAS, the blazing fire quickly spread to Bay Street in downtown Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, consequently, Henry Bradley was the first firefighter in the City of Jacksonville to perish in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, despite his sacrifice, Mr. Bradley was initially buried in the segregated black section of the City's cemetery in an unmarked grave; and

WHEREAS, more than a century later in 2023, a headstone bearing Henry Bradley's name, was placed at the Old City Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Mr. Bradley's demise in the line of duty, the City government created a Jacksonville Fire Department staffed and operated by professionally paid firefighters; and

WHEREAS, Henry Bradley's memory was honored with a plaque at the Fallen Firefighter Memorial at Fire Station No. 1 on Liberty Street; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to honor Henry Bradley's significant sacrifice for, and contributions to, the City of Jacksonville by naming the City-owned building located at 12 Catherine Street, Jacksonville, Florida, in Council District 7, the historic Catherine Street Fire Station (Station 3) which now houses a Firefighters Museum, as the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum"; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 122.105, Ordinance Code, to

 name the City-owned Firefighters Museum building have been met, the public hearings have been held, and the Planning and Development Department and Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission ("JHPC") have submitted a report and advisory recommendation to the City Council, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Section of the Community Planning Division of the Planning and Development Department provided its report in accordance with Section 122.105(b), Ordinance Code, and the JHPC reviewed this report at its meeting on August 27, 2025, in accordance with Section 122.105(c), Ordinance Code, and both recommend approval of the proposed naming as reflected in the Report of the Historic Preservation Section and Advisory Recommendation of the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission and the excerpt from the transcript of the August 27, 2025, JHPC meeting attached hereto collectively as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the naming of the aforementioned City-owned building to the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum" as described above, the Council also desires to honor Mr. Bradley by renaming the street on which the building is located to 'Henry Bradley Place"; and

WHEREAS, in keeping with this request, the Public Works Department, Development Services Division, issued a staff recommendation to approve the renaming of "Catherine Street" to "Henry Bradley Place" and a copy of said recommendation is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, on September 3, 2025, the 911 Emergency Addressing Advisory Committee considered the request during a public meeting and voted to accept the staff recommendation to rename "Catherine Street' to "Henry Bradley Place" and a copy of the Summary of Meeting Minutes of said meeting is attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated

herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, in addition, the Historic Preservation Section of the Community Planning Division of the Planning and Development Department issued a Memorandum with a recommendation to approve the renaming of "Catherine Street" to "Henry Bradley Place" and a copy of said staff recommendation is attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2025, the JHPC held a public meeting where it considered this matter and voted to accept the recommendation to rename "Catherine Street" to "Henry Bradley Place" and a copy of an excerpt of the minutes of said meeting is attached hereto as Exhibit 5 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, upon this legislation becoming effective, the City will install a new street sign at the affected roadway segment to reflect "Henry Bradley Place" as the designated street name; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Naming of City-Owned Building in Council District 7 to Honor Henry Bradley Approved. The City-owned building located at 12 Catherine Street, Jacksonville, Florida, in District 7, is hereby named the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum" to honor the legacy and recognize the contributions of Henry Bradley to the City of Jacksonville.

Section 2. Waiver of Timeline Established in Section 122.105, Ordinance Code. The timeline established in Section 122.105 (Public buildings, public facilities and public parks naming and renaming procedures), Part 1 (Municipal Buildings and Offices), Chapter 122 (Public Property), Ordinance Code, pursuant to which the Historic Preservation Section of the Community Planning Division of the Planning and Development Department shall issue a report and the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission shall issue an advisory recommendation to the City Council pertaining to the naming of a

public building is hereby waived. The requirements of Section 122.105, Ordinance Code, with respect to delivery of a report and recommendation to the City Council pertaining to the naming of a City-owned building have been met. However, the Planning and Development Department completed its report and the JHPC rendered its advisory opinion prior to introduction of this legislation thus necessitating the need for this waiver.

Place". The portion of "Catherine Street" located south of Bay Street on which the Firefighters Museum is located is hereby renamed "Henry Bradley Place" by which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter known and designated. A copy of the map of Henry Bradley Place is attached hereto as Exhibit 6 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Division. The Chief of the Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to send a copy of this Ordinance, once enacted, to the Public Works Department, Development Services and Traffic Engineering Divisions, for processing, implementation, and coordination with 911 Emergency, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, the U.S. Postal Service, and other affected agencies and organizations pertaining to the road renaming approved herein.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
