ORDINANCE 2026-248

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026-2027 ALLOCATION OF FUNDING PERCENTAGES FOR THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS FUNDED CATEGORIES, AND ESTABLISHING THE FISCAL YEAR 2026-2027 OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT APPLICATION PROCESS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 84 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance establishes the FY 2026-2027 allocation of funding percentages for the Opioid Settlement Proceeds funded categories and also establishes the FY 2026-2027 grant application process to be conducted in accordance with Chapter 84, *Ordinance Code*. This serves the public health and welfare as the opioid settlement proceeds grants are allocated to eligible organizations performing services in Duval County related to the prevention, treatment, and/or recovery for individuals with opioid use disorders and co-occurring substance use disorders or mental health conditions. This legislation helps to ensure the settlement proceeds are allocated appropriately to fund the services most needed.
