Attachment 1 - Project Description

This action approves funding in the amount of \$196,000.00, under the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) to the City of Jacksonville, Florida for the expansion and enhancement of their air monitoring activities. Specifically, the recipient will conduct mobile monitoring to identify Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) plumes and VOC/air toxic hotspots and to identify industrial sources of odor complaints. The activities include collecting quality assured VOC/air toxic measurements in support of (1) monthly mobile surveys in the disadvantaged communities of Jacksonville's Health Zone 1 and (2) attribution of odor complaints. The anticipated deliverables include one new equipment deployed in a mobile vehicle to measure air pollution and development of quality assurance/quality control documentation. The expected outcomes include problem identification, information about air quality in previously unmonitored areas, informed policy and decision making by air agencies, mitigation actions from parties responsible for certain air pollution, and change in behavior of public based on new air quality information. There will be increased disadvantaged communities monitored for air quality, public awareness of ambient air quality, and access to information and tools that increase understanding and reduction of environmental and human health risks. There will also be reductions of ambient concentrations of certain air pollutant(s) and human exposure to certain air pollutant(s). The intended beneficiaries include Duval County residents. No subawards are included in this assistance agreement.
