A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING GARRETT SCANTLING ON HIS SELECTION TO THE 2020 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM AS A DECATHLETE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Jacksonville native Garrett Scantling graduated from Hendricks Avenue Elementary School and the Episcopal School of Jacksonville, where he was an outstanding multi-sport athlete, and earned his bachelor's degree in financial planning at the University of Georgia which he attended on a track and field scholarship; and

17 WHEREAS, despite never having competed in an official decathlon, 18 which is not an event sponsored by the Florida High School Athletic 19 Association, Mr. Scantling excelled in the event from his first meet 20 as a Georgia Bulldog freshman, achieving a score that ranked him fifth on Georgia's all-time decathlon performance list. Over the 21 22 course of his years of competition at Georgia his performances 23 continued to improve to the point where in his junior season he 24 finished fourth in the NCAA Championship in the event and in 2016 was 25 invited to participate in the decathlon at Hypo-Meeting in Götzis, 26 Austria, one of the world's most prestigious decathlon and pentathlon 27 events; and

28 WHEREAS, in 2016 Mr. Scantling finished fourth in the trial for 29 a place on the U.S. track and field team, just missing out on a trip 30 to the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, and retired from the sport. After

1 tryouts as a wide receiver with the Atlanta Falcons and Jacksonville 2 Jaguars, he took a job as a financial planner, but still harbored the 3 dream of resurrecting his decathlon career for another try at an 4 Olympic team berth; and

WHEREAS, in 2019 Garrett Scantling returned to the University 5 of Georgia as an assistant track and field coach and resumed training 6 7 for a restart of his Olympic decathlon dream. The delay of the 2020 Tokyo Summer Olympics to 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic gave him 8 9 the opportunity to have surgery to repair an ankle injury and to 10 spend another year regaining his previous form, and in June 2021 at historic Hayward Field at the University of Oregon he placed first 11 at the Olympic trials to lead the U.S. decathletes to Tokyo; and 12

WHEREAS, Mr. Scantling performed extremely well in Tokyo, finishing fifth or better in six of the ten events to earn a total score of 8,611, placing him fourth in the overall standings and narrowly missing out on the bronze medal; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City hereby honors and commends Garrett Scantling on his selection to the United States' 2020 Summer Olympic team as a decathlete and commends him on his outstanding performance at the games. Mr. Scantling's achievement demonstrates the power of perseverance and belief in oneself to overcome obstacles and achieve long-held dreams. His performance will be an inspiration to many who hear his story of persistence in chasing a dream.
