ΑN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 150.103 (DEFINITIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 150 (ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REVISE AND ADD CERTAIN DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Section 150.103 (Definitions), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Ordinance Code. Section 150.103 (Definitions), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Chapter 150 - ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE PART 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 150.103 - Definitions.

In this Chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) Adult Bookstore means a place or an establishment where a substantial portion of the items, materials, goods, or products sold or rented, offered for sale or rent, displayed, or exhibited constitute Adult Material. A place or establishment has a "substantial portion" of Adult Material if any of the following criteria are satisfied:

- 1. More than forty percent (40%) of the floor area of the establishment (excluding any portion of the establishment not open to the public which may include storerooms, stock areas, bathrooms, basements, attics, or administrative offices) is devoted to Adult Material; or
- More than forty percent (40%) of the merchandise displayed for sale or rent in the establishment consists of Adult Material.

where books, magazines, motion pictures, videotapes, digital video discs, photographs, prints, periodicals, recordings, novelties and devices, or any of these things, which have as their primary or dominant theme matters depicting, illustrating, describing or relating to specified sexual activities, are sold or rented or offered for sale or rental to adults and includes a place with only a portion or Section of its area set aside for the display or sale of this material to adults, except that a place, otherwise included within this definition, shall be exempt from the provisions of this Chapter so long as the material is kept in a location where it is not visible and shall not be a self-service item for the customers of such place, provided further, that no more than 40 percent of the display space is used for the display of adult materials.

\* \* \*

- (mm) Adult Material means any of the following, regardless of whether it is new or used:
  - 1. Books, magazines, periodicals, or other printed matter, or photographs, films, motion pictures, digital video disks ("DVDs"), video cassettes, videotape, slides, prints, computer digital graphic recordings, or other visual representations, regardless of medium, which are distinguished or characterized by their emphasis on matters

depicting, describing or relating to specified sexual activities or specified anatomical areas; or

Instruments, novelties, devices, or paraphernalia that are designed for use in connection with specified sexual activities, excluding bona fide birth control devices.

Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Section 2. Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 3. Requesting one cycle emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The Ordinance Code provision being modified by this legislation is currently being challenged in numerous administrative and judicial actions. This legislation is necessary to resolve those litigation cases and taking this up as an emergency will reduce litigation expenses.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become Section 4. effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
