A RESOLUTION HONORING AND CONGRATULATING THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY ON THE OCCASION OF ITS 50^{TH} ANNIVERSARY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the authority now known as the Jacksonville Transportation Authority was established in 1955 by the Florida Legislature as the Jacksonville Expressway Authority which built and operated major roads and bridges including the Fuller Warren Bridge, the Isaiah D. Hart Bridge and J. Turner Butler Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, in 1971 the Jacksonville Expressway Authority was converted by the Florida Legislature into the Jacksonville Transportation Authority when it expanded its transportation portfolio into mass transit by assuming operation of the private bus system in Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, in the succeeding five decades the JTA has tremendously expanded its scope of operations, constructing the Napoleon Bonaparte Broward (Dames Point) Bridge and the Wonderwood Expressway, among many other roadways; constructing and operating the Automated Skyway Express, providing on-demand paratransit service (Connexion Plus), constructing and operating the First Coast Flyer bus rapid transit (BRT) system and taking over operation of the St. Johns River Ferry; and

WHEREAS, the JTA has been an outstanding partner with the City in many endeavors, including partnering with the City to share local option gas tax revenues to construct a list of Better Jacksonville

Plan road projects that were uncompleted with BJP sales tax funding, operating the Stadium Shuttle system to transport fans from remote parking lots to TIAA Bank Field for Jacksonville Jaguars, Florida/Georgia, Gator Bowl and other football games, and supporting downtown redevelopment via transit-oriented development projects; and

WHEREAS, JTA is recognized as one of the finest transportation authorities in the country, earning a White House Champions of Change Award in 2015, being named the Outstanding Public Transportation System Achievement Award winner from the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) in 2016 and 2020, and earning an APTA Innovation Award in 2021; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and congratulates the Jacksonville Transportation Authority, its Executive Director Nathaniel Ford, the JTA board of directors, and the authority's staff on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the JTA's creation and extends its best wishes for much continued success in the years to come. The JTA is a vital component of the physical mobility, economic vitality and connectivity of the City of Jacksonville and Northeast Florida.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
