5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$575,000.00,  
6 INCLUDING \$431,250.00 IN GRANT FUNDING AWARDED  
7 BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY  
8 THROUGH ITS FISCAL YEAR 2022 PORT SECURITY GRANT  
9 PROGRAM AND A \$143,750.00 CITY MATCH, TO  
10 PURCHASE ONE 37' ALUMINUM, OPEN-OCEAN AND  
11 INSHORE, CBRNE CAPABLE FIRE SUPPRESSION HAZMAT  
12 RESPONSE BOAT, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-010;  
13 PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND  
14 RESCUE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.  
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16 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

17 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,  
18 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated  
19 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)  
20 listed in subsection (b):

27 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

28 The funding above represents an appropriation of  
29 \$575,000.00, including \$431,250.00 in grant funding  
30 awarded by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security through  
31 its Fiscal Year 2022 Port Security Grant Program, and a

1           \$143,750.00 City match. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue  
2           Department (JFRD) will use the funds to purchase one  
3           aluminum, open-ocean and inshore, CBRNE capable fire  
4           suppression hazmat response boat. The grant period of  
5           performance commences September 1, 2022 and ends August  
6           31, 2025.

7           **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in  
8           Section 1 is to provide funding for the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue  
9           Department to purchase one 37' aluminum, open-ocean and inshore,  
10          CBRNE capable fire suppression hazmat response boat. The Department  
11          of Homeland Security's Port Security Grant Program is one of a number  
12          of programs that are aimed at strengthening the nation's critical  
13          infrastructure against risks associated with terrorist attacks. The  
14          grant funding is awarded for projects and activities that increase  
15          port-wide risk management and protect critical surface transportation  
16          infrastructure from acts of terrorism, major disasters, and other  
17          emergencies in an effort to strengthen national preparedness and  
18          resiliency by enhancing maritime security. A copy of the Fiscal Year  
19          2022 Port Security Grant Program Award Letter (Grant Number: EMW-  
20          2022-PU-00202-S01) providing the terms and conditions relative to  
21          receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed **On File**  
22          with the Office of Legislative Services.

23          **Section 3. Oversight.** The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue  
24          Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee  
25          administration of the grant described herein.

26          **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become  
27          effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
28          without the Mayor's signature.
