BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
Section 1. Amending Section 106.106 (Balanced Budget and
Budget Stabilization Reserve), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter

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1 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code. Section 106.106 2 (Balanced Budget and Budget Stabilization Reserve), Part 1 (General 3 Provisions), Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance 4 Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 106 - BUDGET AND ACCOUNTING CODE

PART 1. - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 106.106. - Balanced Budget and Budget Stabilization Reserve. (a) Balanced Budget.

10 The annual General Fund/General Services District budget for (1)recurring expenditures of the City of Jacksonville shall be 11 balanced from current year revenues. Current year revenue for 12 13 the purposes of this Section shall not include General Fund/General Services District Operating or Emergency 14 Reserves. Any use of Operating or Emergency Reserves for non-15 16 recurring expenditures shall be limited in total to one and one-quarter percent (1.25%) of the General Fund/General 17 Services District proposed budget and shall be subject 18 further to all other restrictions for uses of these funds 19 20 unassigned general fund general service district fund 21 balance.

22 (2) The annual General Fund budget shall contain, at a minimum:

- (i) Operating costs sufficient to maintain operations for the fiscal year;
- (ii) Debt service;

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- (iii) Transfers to independent agencies;
- 27 (iv) Funding for renewal, replacement and improvement of 28 capital assets;
 - (v) Funding of reserves; and
- 30 (vi) Funding of contingencies.
- 31 (3) The annual budget proposal shall not be considered a balanced

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1 budget if it contains any of the following: A two percent (2%) overall lapse of the General 2 (i) 3 Fund/General Services District proposed budget, (ii) A four percent (4%) per department lapse, including 4 5 Constitutional Officers, or (iii) A combined use of General Fund/General Services District 6 7 Operating Reserves or Emergency Reserves greater than one and one-quarter percent (1.25%) of the General 8 9 Fund/General Services District proposed budget. 10 Section 2. Amending Section 106.203 (Contents), Subpart A 11 (Budgets and Budget Ordinances; Millage Levy), Part 2 (Budgets), 12 13 Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code. Section 106.203 (Contents), Subpart A (Budgets and Budget Ordinances; Millage 14 Levy), Part 2 (Budgets), Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), 15 Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows: 16 CHAPTER 106 - BUDGET AND ACCOUNTING CODE 17 18 PART 2. - BUDGETS 19 20 SUBPART A. - BUDGETS AND BUDGET ORDINANCES; MILLAGE LEVY 21 22 Sec. 106.203. - Contents. (a) The annual budget ordinance of the general government and of the 23 24 independent agencies shall be limited to recognizing the City's 25 authorized and approved revenues, expenses, contingencies and 26 reserves, and shall not include reorganizations, codifications, or the establishment of new fees, all of which shall be established 27 by separate ordinance. The annual budget proposals of the general 28 29 government and of the independent agencies shall be composed of two parts, an operating budget and a capital improvement budget. 30 The operating budget part of the general government shall contain 31

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an appropriation to the mobile equipment account of the Fleet 1 2 Management Division and the mobile equipment accounts of the various activities in the Enterprise Funds in a combined amount at 3 least equal to the depreciation and proceeds from surplus sales of 4 mobile equipment of the current fiscal year. The appropriation 5 shall be calculated as an annualized projection based on the 6 7 current fiscal year's first six months of depreciation and surplus sales of equipment adjusted as necessary. The annual budget 8 9 proposals shall in all other ways be set forth in such form and 10 detail as the Mayor or each independent agency may determine. The budget shall not be considered a balanced budget if it contains 11 12 either a two percent overall lapse, or a four percent per department lapse, including Constitutional Officers. 13

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15 Section 3. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the 16 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 17 division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 18 herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the 19 Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are 20 approved and directed herein, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall 21 be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

22 Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 23 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 24 without the Mayor's signature.
