8 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$910,471.00 FROM THE  
9 FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY THROUGH THE  
10 STATE OF FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY  
11 MANAGEMENT UNDER THE HAZARD MITIGATION  
12 ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM TO FUND THE ACQUISITION  
13 AND INSTALLATION OF SEVEN (7) PERMANENT  
14 GENERATORS AT SEVEN (7) STORMWATER PUMP STATION  
15 SITES WITHIN DUVAL COUNTY, AS INITIATED BY  
16 REVISED B.T. 21-038; AMENDING THE 2021-2025  
17 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY  
18 ORDINANCE 2020-505-E TO PURCHASE AND INSTALL  
19 PERMANENT EMERGENCY GENERATORS AT THE FOLLOWING  
20 LOCATIONS: HILLMAN DRIVE, MYRTLE AVENUE, HILLY  
21 ROAD, BRADLEY ROAD, JESSIE STREET, MCGIRTS CREEK  
22 PARK/LEW BRANTLEY AND SANDALWOOD CANAL;  
23 PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT  
24 OF PUBLIC WORKS, PUBLIC BUILDINGS DIVISION;  
25 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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27 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

28 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2020-2021 fiscal year,  
29 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated  
30 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)  
31 listed in subsection (b):

7 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

8 The funding above represents a Hazard Mitigation Grant  
9 Program ("HMGP") award in the amount of \$910,471.00 from  
10 the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") through  
11 the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management  
12 ("FDEM") to fund the acquisition and installation of  
13 elevated emergency generators and supporting  
14 infrastructure at seven (7) stormwater pump station sites  
15 within Duval County to reduce and/or mitigate damage from  
16 severe weather or other hazards. A local match of 25% is  
17 required and will be appropriated as part of the fiscal  
18 year 2021-2022 budget.

19 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in  
20 Section 1 is to fund the acquisition and installation of seven (7)  
21 permanent emergency generators and supporting electrical  
22 infrastructure at the following seven (7) stormwater pump station  
23 sites within Duval County (the "Project"): Hillman Drive, Myrtle  
24 Avenue, Hilly Road, Bradley Road, Jessie Street, McGirts Creek  
25 Park/Lew Brantley and Sandalwood Canal (collectively, the "Pump  
26 Stations"). The generators will allow for continuous connectivity  
27 and operation of the Pump Stations in the event of an outage during  
28 severe weather events and other emergency situations. These functions  
29 are considered critical to public safety. All activities shall be  
30 completed in strict compliance with applicable federal, state and  
31 local rules and regulations.

1           The term of the grant, and the period of performance for the  
2 Project, shall begin upon the City and FDEM's execution of that  
3 certain Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement Number HO543  
4 (the "Grant Agreement") and shall end on July 31, 2023. A copy of  
5 the Grant Agreement has been placed **Revised On File** with the Office  
6 of Legislative Services.

7           **Section 3.           Capital Improvement Plan Amendment.** Ordinance  
8 2020-505-E, adopting the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan  
9 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is  
10 hereby amended to provide funding for the Project, as more fully  
11 described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as **Revised**  
12 **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council  
13 finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next  
14 annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests  
15 of the community because such deferral will delay the acquisition and  
16 installation of urgently-needed emergency generator systems at  
17 multiple critical stormwater pump station locations to reduce and/or  
18 mitigate the damage that might otherwise occur from severe weather  
19 or other hazards. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), *Ordinance Code*,  
20 enactment of this ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-  
21 thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of  
22 the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This ordinance shall  
23 constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other  
24 respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by  
25 Ordinance 2020-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full  
26 force and effect.

27           **Section 4.           Oversight Department.** The Department of Public  
28 Works, Public Buildings Division, shall oversee the Project and  
29 administration of the Grant Agreement described herein.

30           **Section 5.           Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become  
31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
