Directly East of the Blount Island Marine Terminal are six (6) aerial high-voltage electric transmission lines owned by JEA that cross the St. Johns River at the Fulton Cut Crossing. These transmission lines currently create an air draft restriction of 175 feet for vessels traveling to JAXPORT's Blount Island Terminal. This height is an impediment to the growing fleet of international cargo ships requiring a higher operational clearance of 205 feet above mean-high-tide to create, protect, and expand jobs and economic impact.					
On March 27, 2023, the City Council approved 2022-874-E to provide partial funding for the project not to exceed \$22,500,000, which was to be appropriated over a series of years.					
The project costs estimated at 60% design were \$42-45 million, with funding being identified accordingly. As the project has progressed, JEA has now completed final 100% design and engineering with updated project costs of \$117 million. With the State of Florida allocation of \$22.5 million remaining in place, JAXPORT will now contribute \$32.5 million, JEA will contribute \$32.5 million, and the City will reauthorize and contribute \$10 million in originally authorized grants, convert the previously authorized \$12.5 million in loans to grants, accept and re-appropriate savings from the recently completed Harbor Deeping Project in the amount of \$7 million, and provide for a City Additional Grant of \$5 million only available if total project costs exceed \$117 million, with JAXPORT and JEA being responsible for any further overruns on a 50/50 basis.					
This project will support economic growth and jobs in Jacksonville and the State of Florida.

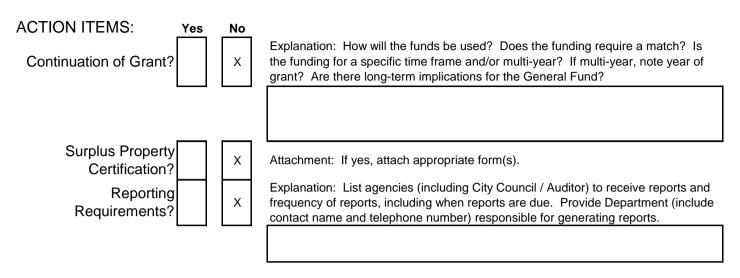
