RESOLUTION 2024-449-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING TOM WILLS HIS NEARLY 50 YEARS OF SERVICE TO JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY AΤ WJXT CHANNEL INCLUDING AS THE ANCHOR OF THE EVENING NEWS FOR MORE THAN 40 YEARS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Tom Wills, a native of Pittsburgh, earned his WHEREAS, journalism degree from American University and began his journalism career as a reporter at WTOP radio and WTOP-TV in Washington D.C.; and

WHEREAS, during his 11-year tenure in Washington, Mr. Wills covered some of the most important news events of the second half of the 20th century, including the riots following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the funeral of Robert F. Kennedy, the U.S. Supreme Court's hearings on the "Pentagon Papers", the Watergate break-in, and President Richard Nixon's resignation from office; and

WHEREAS, in 1975, Tom Wills moved to Jacksonville to take a position with WJXT Channel 4 as co-anchor of the evening news; in 1981, he was joined at the anchor desk by Deborah Gianoulis and sportscaster Sam Kouvaris and together with legendary meteorologist George Winterling who had already been at the station since 1962, the quartet became the longest-tenured news broadcasting team in Jacksonville history with 22 years together until the retirement of Ms. Gianoulis in 2003. Mr. Wills then teamed with Mary Baer as his co-anchor and meteorologist John Gaughan for another 20 years until

their retirements in 2023; and

whereas, as a local station not affiliated with a national network, Channel 4 has always devoted a tremendous amount of its resources and airtime to news programming throughout the day, and aggressive investigative journalism has been a station tradition from its founding. Throughout his five decades at the anchor desk, Tom Wills has reported, interpreted, and provided context for every important story in Jacksonville and Northeast Florida over the last half-century, from natural and man-made disasters to politics, crime, and education, and from interesting and unusual events to heartwarming human-interest stories and inspiring good news; and

WHEREAS, in his five decades at Channel 4, Mr. Wills has developed a deep and enduring connection with his viewers and has been relied upon as a trusted and reliable provider of the important news of the day for several generations of Northeast Florida and Southeast Georgia residents; and

WHEREAS, it has recently been announced that Tom Wills will be retiring from WJXT after an illustrious career that has made him a beloved institution in Jacksonville; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends WJXT Channel 4 news anchor Tom Wills for his nearly five decades of service to the Jacksonville community on the occasion of his retirement and extends its very best wishes for health and happiness in the years to come. His professionalism, calm demeanor, dedication to fair and honest reporting, and love for the Northeast Florida community have made him a legendary figure in journalism in our area and his reassuring presence on the air every evening will be greatly missed and gratefully remembered.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
