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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2021 Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) Update

The State of Florida requires each county to submit a Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) every four years for review. The Local CEMP provides guidance on procedures, organization, and responsibilities. It also encourages standardization to facilitate an integrated and coordinated response among local, state, federal and private nonprofit entities to protect against, prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the impacts of a wide variety of disasters that could adversely affect the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of and visitors to Jacksonville.

The 2021 City of Jacksonville CEMP updates organizational structures and incorporates information from the 2020 City of Jacksonville Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS). Most of the State of Florida CEMP requirements are satisfied by City of Jacksonville Ordinance Code, Section 674.

Updates to the 2021 CEMP include the following:

- Clarified role of CEMP as the "Base Plan," with annexes consisting of: Recovery Plan (2021), Continuity of Operations Plans (2021), Continuity of Government Plan (2021), Local Mitigation Strategy (2020), Hazard Specific Plans, Emergency Operations Plans, Position Specific Checklists, Standard Operating Guides, and Standard Operating Procedures.
- Revised terminology, "Special Needs populations," to "Special Medical Needs populations."
- Revised Mitigation Organizational Chart.
- Incorporated Duval COAD (Community Organizations Active in Disasters) as a partner agency.
- Developed Emergency Plans Organizational Structure chart (Attachment 2).
- Updated planning assumptions.
- Updated population and demographics.
- Updated Hazard Analysis.
- Updated recommended training for EOC Staff.
- Updated Evacuation Zones based on new data and mapping tools.
- Updated Evacuation Routes based on new data for Evacuation Zones.
