AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$845,350.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY ("USDOE") ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND CONSERVATION BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM TO FUND JEA'S RESTORE, REPAIR AND RESILIENCY PROGRAM, SAID FUNDS TO SUPPORT EFFORTS TO CONDUCT ENERGY AUDITS AND WEATHERIZATION REPAIRS THAT LOWER ENERGY BILLS FOR UP TO 110 LOW INCOME RESIDENTS OF JACKSONVILLE (THE "PROJECT"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-116; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of a \$845,350.00 grant from the USDOE Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program to fund JEA's Restore, Repair and Resiliency (R3) Program which supports efforts to conduct energy audits and weatherization repairs that lower energy bills for up to 110 low-income residents. JEA has agreed to provide these updates to such residents in single-family, owner-occupied homes within 24 months (two years) of receiving the grant as required by the grant requirements. A copy of the grant award letter from the U.S. Department of Energy is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to support efforts to conduct energy audits and weatherization repairs that lower energy bills for up to 110 low-income residents. Services will include blower door tests to measure air that leaks out of the home, installation of a data monitoring system to measure climate inside the home, and provide for the replacement of HVAC units, doors, insulation, and energy efficient lightbulbs. The Project will focus on low-income households in the City's Historic Eastside, then expand city-wide. JEA is considered a subrecipient and is responsible for seeing the Project to completion.

Section 3. Oversight. The Neighborhoods Department shall oversee the Project and administration of the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
