RESOLUTION 2023-382

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING RITA REAGAN FOR HER OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP AND EFFORTS TO PRESERVE AND REVITALIZE THE NORMAN STUDIOS MOVIE PRODUCTION COMPLEX IN ARLINGTON; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Rita Reagan, a graduate of Eastern Kentucky University, the University of North Florida and the University of Florida, is a lifelong educator. She taught English for the U.S. Army at an adult education center in Germany for a year and taught in South Florida for several years before arriving in Jacksonville. Over the next 30 years, Ms. Regan served with the Duval County Schools in a wide variety of capacities from teaching to grant-writing to program development; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Reagan has also devoted decades of her time and energies to leading and supporting many community organizations. is a founder and board member of Old Arlington Inc., a board member and archivist for the Springfield Improvement Association, a founder of the Springfield Heritage Museum and Education Center, a board member of The Bridge: A Full Service Youth Center; a board member for the Epilepsy Foundation, a member of the Hogan's Creek Greenway Park Task Force, and many others; and

WHEREAS, Rita Reagan has most recently devoted nearly two decades of intensive efforts to lead the charge to preserve and revitalize the Norman Film Studio complex on Arlington Road, one of the last remaining vestiges of Jacksonville's heritage as a preeminent film production city in the early days of movie-making; and

WHEREAS, Richard E. Norman purchased the former Eagle Film City Studios on Arlington Road in 1920 and made silent films there for the next 8 years, primarily for Black audiences featuring all-Black casts portraying Black life and stories in positive ways. Norman Studio is the last "race film" studio known to remain intact in the country and is a reminder of the role Jacksonville played as the "Winter Film Capital of the World" from 1907 to the early 1920's before the movie industry moved to California; and

WHEREAS, Rita Reagan spearheaded the campaign to convince the City to purchase the Norman Studio property in 2003, and to reunify, restore and reopen the National Historic Landmark property as a museum and event center; and

WHEREAS, her concerted efforts and leadership over these many years have paid off and, with a combination of City appropriations and grant funding, the initial phase of the Norman Studio complex restoration is nearing completion and will soon open for the public's education and enjoyment; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Rita Reagan for her decades of tireless efforts to preserve and revitalize the historically significant Norman Studios silent film production complex on Arlington Road as a reminder of Jacksonville's prominence in the history of movie making. Her exceptional leadership and dogged determination have brought the first phase of the project to a successful completion and the City and the residents of Jacksonville are grateful for all her efforts.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
