AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$249,953.00 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES ("COPS"), TO FUND THE EXPANSION OF THE INTEGRATING COMMUNICATIONS, ASSESSMENT, AND TACTICS (ICAT) COURSE INCLUDING THE PURCHASE OF VIRTUAL REALITY EQUIPMENT AND OTHER RELATED EXPENSES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-036; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is an appropriation of grant funds from the Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, to fund the enhancement and expansion of the Integrating Communications, Assessment, and Tactics ("ICAT") course by offering the ICAT course agency-wide, purchasing virtual reality ("VR") equipment and related software maintenance, and funding overtime related to training, collecting data and information, and reviewing incidents. The grant period commenced on October 1, 2023 and shall continue through September 30, 2025. No local match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the enhancement and expansion of the ICAT course to further embed the concept of community policing into the fabric of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office ("JSO"), by purchasing virtual reality ("VR") equipment, providing the VR-enhanced ICAT training to officers and recruits, collecting project related data and information, and reviewing the number of incidents using force annually.

The ICAT course was developed by the Police Executive Research Forum and designed as an integrated training approach that brings together verbal and tactical techniques to peacefully resolve tense encounters. Providing the VR-enhanced ICAT course agencywide will help narrow the ICAT knowledge gap between new and veteran officers giving them a common operating picture to work from and, ultimately, increasing positive public safety outcomes for officers and citizens.

A copy of the Grant Award Letter (Award Number 15JCOPS-23-GG-02527-PPSE) with conditions, is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Oversight. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office shall oversee and administer the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
