AN ORDINANCE AMENDING 2025-504-E, THE FY 2025-2026 BUDGET ORDINANCE, TO REPLACE SCHEDULE B1A IN ORDER TO (1) ADD A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$204,000.00 FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT (FDLE) FOR THE FUSION CENTER (THE "FUSION CENTER GRANT"), (2) ADD A GRANT IN THE OF \$150,000.00 FROM THE CHARTRAND AMOUNT FOUNDATION FOR THE PEACE OFFICER WELLNESS EMPATHY AND RESILIENCE ("POWER") PROGRAM, (3) ADD A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00 FROM FDLE FOR ONLINE STING OPERATIONS, AND (4) ADD A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000.00 FROM FDLE FOR OPERATION STRIKING DISTANCE, ALL WITHIN THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; APPROPRIATING THE FUSION CENTER GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$204,000.00 FROM THE FDLE TO FUND DOMESTIC SECURITY ANALYSTS FOR THE NORTHEAST FLORIDA FUSION CENTER (NEFFC), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 26-014; AUTHORIZING TWO JSO FUSION CENTER ANALYST POSITIONS AND 2,080 PART-TIME HOURS WITHIN THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 26-027; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

 WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2025-21-E, Council appropriated grant funding from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) to fund domestic security analysts for the Northeast Florida Fusion Center (NEFFC) (the "Fusion Center Grant");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2025-217-E, Council appropriated grant funding from the Chartrand Family Fund to fund the Peace Officer Wellness Empathy and Resilience (POWER) program (the "POWER Grant");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2025-65-E, Council appropriated grant funding from the FDLE to fund the Online Sting Operations program (the "Online Sting Operations Grant");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2025-338-E, Council appropriated grant funding from the FDLE to fund the Operation Striking Distance project (the "Operation Striking Distance Grant");

WHEREAS, the foregoing grants are each continuation grants with no required match from the City, but were inadvertently left off of the Schedule Bla, entitled "Schedule of Continuation Grants / Programs With No City Match," which was attached to Ordinance 2025-504-E, the FY 2025-2026 Budget Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the grant funding related to the Fusion Center Grant for the 2025-2026 fiscal year is being appropriated hereby so that the activities related thereto are not delayed; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending 2025-504-E, the FY 2025-2026 Budget Ordinance, to replace Schedule Bla. Ordinance 2025-504-E, the FY 2025-2026 Budget Ordinance, is hereby amended to replace Second Revised Schedule Bla, entitled "Schedule of Continuation Grants / Programs With No City Match," with the Third Revised Schedule Bla attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and incorporated herein by this reference, in order to include the following grants which were inadvertently left of off this Schedule: (1) the Fusion Center Grant in the amount of \$204,000 from FDLE, including two full-time positions

and 2,080 part-time hours within the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, (2) the POWER Grant in the amount of \$150,000 from the Chartrand Family Fund, (3) the Online Sting Operations Grant in the amount of \$100,000 from FDLE, and (4) the Operation Striking Distance Grant in the amount of \$400,000 from FDLE, including 3,465 part-time hours within the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office.

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of grant funds from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) (the "Fusion Center Grant") to hire and train two JSO Fusion Center Analysts and provide 2,080 part-time hours for the Northeast Florida Fusion Center (NEFFC). The grant period commenced on July 1, 2025 and shall continue through June 30, 2026. No local match is required.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to provide funding for the hiring and training of two JSO Fusion Center Analysts and provide 2,080 part-time hours to serve as domestic security analysts for the Northeast Florida Fusion Center (NEFFC). Through the application of extensive analytical research and interpretive skills, the positions will provide intelligence on crime trends and threats to Florida with the critical infrastructure
