telecommunications, financial and manufacturing. Dun & Bradstreet is most widely known for providing
due diligence and data services from their extensive database of over 100 million companies around the
globe. D&B, which does not currently have a presence in Jacksonville, is considering relocating its
corporate headquarters to an existing building in Jacksonville and creating 500 new jobs at an average
wage of \$77,000. The company is also considering other locations in the U.S. for the proposed
headquarters relocation. This is a highly sought-after and an extremely competitive situation. The
company has stated that the City of Jacksonville and State of Florida financial incentives are a material
factor in their decision to relocate their headquarters operation to Jacksonville, Florida.
