RESOLUTION 2025-230

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CITY COUNCIL'S OPPOSITION TO THE OPENING OF ANY PORTION OF PUMPKIN HILL CREEK, LOCATED IN THE PUMPKIN HILL CREEK PRESERVE STATE PARK, TO ALLOW RECREATIONAL AND COMMERCIAL SHRIMP HARVESTING; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE FLORIDA CONSERVATION COMMISSION FISH AND WILDLIFE IMMEDIATELY UPON ITS ADOPTION; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Pumpkin Hill Creek is located in the Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park which is part of a larger area known as the Seven Creeks Recreation Area, managed through a partnership between the National Park Service, the City of Jacksonville and the North Florida Land Trust, and encompasses 5,600 acres of contiguous conservation lands in northeast Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission (the "JWC") is committed to the protection of the waterways of Jacksonville and works in cooperation with multiple state and federal agencies, including the State of Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (the "FWC"), to study and make recommendations to the City Council with respect to the improvement, development and protection of the St. Johns River and all tidal waters in Duval County; and

WHEREAS, in May 2024, the FWC approved updates to the rules pertaining to shrimp harvesting to reorganize and clarify regulations

related to shrimping in Florida waters; the FWC received requests from stakeholders for multiple regulation changes that would increase shrimp harvest opportunities in northeast Florida; and

WHEREAS, after the FWC staff conducted small group meetings, field visits, ride-alongs with commercial shrimp harvesters, and two public workshops to gather feedback on these requests, the FWC recommended opening a section of Pumpkin Hill Creek, a tributary of the Nassau River, to allow recreational and commercial shrimp harvesting from September through December each year, thus increasing harvestable areas; and

WHEREAS, the FWC did not include the JWC as an interested stakeholder in its discussions, nor did it allow a forum for public input provided through the JWC; and

WHEREAS, at the March 13, 2025, meeting of the JWC, the Chair brought the Pumpkin Hill Creek issue to the attention of the JWC, and the JWC unanimously voted that the Chair request the Jacksonville City Council pass a Resolution expressing opposition to FWC's recommendation; and

WHEREAS, the FWC will meet on May 21, 2025, to hold the final vote on its recommendation to update rule language to allow residential and commercial shrimp harvesting in Pumpkin Hill Creek; and

WHEREAS, the City Council strongly encourages representatives from the FWC to attend the next scheduled meeting of the JWC on April 10, 2025, to discuss the opening of Pumpkin Hill Creek to shrimp harvesting and to allow public input through the JWC forum prior to the FWC's May 21, 2025, meeting; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby expresses its opposition to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's recommendation to open a section of Pumpkin Hill Creek for
