Council Member Johnson asked about who may initiate a petition.

Council Member Clark-Murray said that the bill expands who may petition to include an individual citizen, group of citizens, homeowners' association or similar property owners' association, or a City Council Member. Previously, petitions for speed reduction/traffic calming could only be submitted by a neighborhood homeowner's association or group of residents.

He talked about the level of independence/autonomy of JAA and who owns the airport.

Council Member Johnson talked about collaboration with independent authorities.

Mr. Reed, JAA, talked about revenue diversion compliance and how JAA was created through Charter. Council Member Gay talked about the need for clarity about the role of independent agencies.

Travis Jeffrey, Chief of Housing and Community Development, said there are reverters in the donation agreement and the agreements are more stringent than they used to be.

Mrs. Lattimore, Destined for a Change, shared the history of her business on the Eastside and her investment in the community. She described their plans for developing affordable housing and how the disposed property is a part of that.
