Presentation on the state of the Equestrian Center

Peggy Fuller, Tim Jones and Jodi Coxwell, Equestrian Center, spoke about the facility, its programs and its needs. Ms. Fuller shared some of the history of the center, which opened in 2004 and since 2014, it has been managed by the Northeast Florida Equestrian Society, a non-profit organization with a volunteer board of directors. Ms. Fuller talked about challenges for the center, such as deferred maintenance issues. She spoke about the horse therapy program, RV hookups onsite, in-house food and beverage operations and the recent hiring of a director of development to assist with fundraising. Mr. Jones talked about the facility details, with indoor and outdoor arenas. He talked about events held at the center, 65 this year including dog shows and concerts in addition to equestrian events. Ms. Coxwell mentioned some of the more acute maintenance needs, like lighting and electrical problems, and leaks/ flooding. Ms. Coxwell listed some of the center in FY 24-25 was 1: 17 for every City Dollar spent, \$17 is projected in return. The center received a \$393,000 subsidy from the City this year. A young man named Sebastian, who participates in the horse therapy and is a Special Olympian Equestrian, and his grandmother spoke about the benefits of the HORSE therapy program.

Council Member Johnson noted the benefits of such therapy for cancer patients. Council Member Freeman asked how he can advocate for the center. Council Member Salem indicated upcoming legislation to provide funds for the center's acute maintenance needs. Council President White spoke in support of the center and encouraged his colleagues to visit if they haven't already.
