Economic Development Officer Kirk Wendland explained the purpose of the bill, its relation to the City's Public Investment Policy, and the clawback provisions in the event of non-performance by the company. He gave background on the management of the four apartment complexes by Millenia Jax FL prior to their purchase of the complexes and their investment of \$47 million in rehabilitating the units. The company ran into unforeseen challenges and either needs additional funding to complete the rehabilitations as originally contemplated or will renovate the units to a lower standard. The City is offering the equivalent of a REV grant over 10 years to provide the company with \$2 million to assist in the rehabilitation effort. Council members posed questions about inspections of the units for compliance, the loan terms and clawbacks.

Stephanie Sinito, Operations Manager with Millenia Jax, said the company has created some "hotel suites" in on-site buildings to temporarily house residents while their units are being rehabbed. She described the company's history of owning and managing apartments nationwide. The company has never sold a complex it has acquired, and is committed to providing social services to its residents. Council Members Pittman and Bowman asked to be added as co-sponsors. Kim Taylor asked a clarifying question about the start of the 10-year payment clock which starts in June 2020. In response to a question from Council Member Cumber, Mr. Wendland said that the OED has reviewed Millenia's financial statements and is comfortable with their capacity to perform.

Council Member Cumber proposed an amendment to add a provision limiting the incentive to Millenia and making it non-transferable to another company that is not an affiliated entity – the amendment was approved. CAO Brian Hughes explained that US HUD recruited Millenia to come to Jacksonville to remedy the problems and non-compliance issues left by Global Ministries, the previous operator of the complexes.

Budget request discussion

Chairman Bowman distributed a list of budget requests previously submitted for the committee to discuss. Council Member Freeman said he would like to shift the \$100,000 he had requested for public health to mental health programming. Cheryl Johnson, founder of Alex's Dragonfly Coalition, described a coalition that has formed in Jacksonville to remove the stigma from mental health issues and advocate for access to care for those who suffer from various disorders. She advocated for a long-term commitment to an anti-stigma campaign. Council Member DeFoor highlighted the importance of mental health issues and advocated for a global approach to the problem. Council Member Hazouri said there is a need to decide on a comprehensive approach and to eliminate duplication of effort by multiple agencies. Council Member Freeman said the City needs to seek out agencies and organizations that have the capacity to do great work and organize them into a cohesive approach. Council Member Cumber suggested a competitive grant program outside of the PSG process to allocate funding to specific council-prioritized issues, more narrowly focused than the broader areas in the PSG process. She has talked to the Office of Grants and Compliance and they could run this new grant process. Deputy General Counsel Peggy Sidman explained how the Council's allocation for opioid program was directed by Council and contracted through the Office of Grants and Compliance.

\$963,000 for Crime and Safety Reduction Task Force uses (Newby) - consensus approval.

\$300,000 for mental health program initiatives (CM Newby's \$100,000 from Crime and Safety Task Force for mental health, CM Hazouri's \$100,000 for mental health and CM Freeman's \$100,000 repurposed from public health to mental health), with a competitive solicitation process for what Council specifically wants - consensus approval

\$225,000 for A-STEP program (Bowman) - consensus approval

\$1M for a human trafficking initiative competitive grant process for housing, job training and counseling (Cumber) - consensus approval.

\$300,000 for Crime Stoppers for relocation assistance to witnesses who provide tips on crimes (Ferraro). Mr. Ferraro said people are afraid to give tips and tell what they know because of fear of retaliation, so the police are hamstrung in trying to investigate crimes and make arrests. Mr. Hazouri said the Sheriff is going to ask for more personnel in his budget, which is badly needed, and that may be a higher priority. He felt the Council might not want to set a precedent of funding Crime Stoppers directly. Peggy Sidman noted that the City has a 3-year contract with Crime Stoppers and provides additional funding through occasional allocations from the Sheriff's Law Enforcement Trust Fund - consensus approval

\$200,000 for an infant mortality reduction program recommended at the last meeting (Salem). Faye Johnston of the Northeast Florida Healthy Start Coalition described and advocated for the program - consensus approval

\$300,000 placeholder for creation of a Chief Resiliency Officer position (salary and benefits) (Bowman); Kyle Billy will look at what other resiliency officers make around the state - consensus approval

\$250,000 for a Northwest Jax business improvement program though OED (existing beyond façade improvement program) (Pittman) - consensus approval

\$200,000 for derelict vessel removal program (DeFoor). Mr. Ferraro echoed the need for funding to deal with the problem as identified by the Jacksonville Waterways Commission - consensus approval.

\$1,400,000 for council district-specific discretionary funds for capital projects on City-owned properties (Bowman) - consensus approval.

Total request - \$5,138,000
