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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Amending Section 116.905 (Payroll Deductions), 17 Section 1. Part 9 (Personnel Regulations), Chapter 116 (Employees and Employee 18 19 Benefits), Ordinance Code. Section 116.905 (Payroll Deductions), 20 Part 9 (Personnel Regulations), Chapter 116 (Employees and Employee 21 Benefits), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

PART 9. - PERSONNEL REGULATIONS

CHAPTER 116 - EMPLOYEES AND EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

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Sec. 116.905. - Payroll Deductions.

No employee shall be entitled to a payroll deduction from his or her

(d) Deductions for other insurance premiums that were either in effect as of July 1, 2024 or are for a union-sponsored insurance

plan, subject to the following limitations:

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- (2) DeductionsExcept for union-sponsored insurance plans, deductions for the benefit of any payee shall be unlimited so long as <u>no change to a deduction is requested by the</u> <u>employee or payee and at least 100 employees have in effect</u> deductions for the benefit of that payee, but if, at any time, the total number of deductions in effect for the benefit of a payee falls below 100 on any payroll date, no newthe Director of Finance may discontinue all payroll deductions for the benefit of that<u>such</u> payee—shall thereafter be authorized by any employee.
- 13 (3) All deductions shall be made twice monthly by the 14 Department of Finance—and Administration, and the 15 deductions so made shall be remitted by the Department of 16 Finance—and Administration to the proper payees—once_each 17 month.

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- Except for union-sponsored insurance plans, deductions 19 (6) 20 shall be subject to an administrative service fee set by 21 the Director of Finance in an amount reasonably estimated 22 to reimburse the City for its costs, which amount may be deducted from the total of the payment remitted. In the 23 24 event such costs are not reimbursed to the City for a period of time exceeding 90 days, such deduction shall be 25 26 discontinued.
- (e) Deductions for United States Savings Bonds, employee credit
 unions in existence on December 26, 1972, the United Fund, the
 American Cancer Society, the Heart Fund, the Combined Health
 Appeal of Northeast Florida and the dues of the Jacksonville
 Brotherhood of Police Officers, Inc. or the Jacksonville

Brotherhood of Firefighters. All costs associated with the 1 processing and implementation of the payroll deduction 2 authorized for the Jacksonville Brotherhood of Police Officers, 3 Inc. or the Jacksonville Brotherhood of Firefighters or the 4 5 Police Charity Fund shall be reimbursed to the City by that organization. The Director of Finance-and Administration is 6 7 directed to calculate the costs and collect reimbursement from the Jacksonville Brotherhood of Police Officers, Inc. and the 8 9 Jacksonville Brotherhood of Firefighters, respectively, on a 10 periodic basis (not less frequently than quarterly). In the event the costs are not reimbursed to the City for a period of 11 time exceeding 90 days, the payroll deductions for either the 12 Jacksonville Brotherhood of Police Officers, Inc. or 13 the Jacksonville Brotherhood of Firefighters or the Police Charity 14 15 Fund, respectively, shall be discontinued.

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17 (g) Deductions for the purchase of season tickets for the 18 Jacksonville Jaguars National Football League professional 19 football team.

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- 20 (h) Deductions for the purchase of tickets to the annual Gator Bowl 21 bowl game.
- 22 (i) Deductions for voluntary participation in the State of Florida's
 23 Prepaid College Fund.
- 24 (j) Deductions for employees of the JEA as authorized by the Managing
 25 Director of the JEA.
- (k) Deductions for voluntary participation in prearranged cemetery
 or funeral costs. All cost associated with the processing and
 implementation of the payroll deductions authorized by
 subsections (g), (h), and (k) of this Section shall be reimbursed
 to the City by that respective organization. The Director of
 Finance and Administration is directed to calculate the costs

and collect reimbursement from the respective organizations on a periodic basis (not less frequently than quarterly). In the event the costs are not reimbursed to the City for a period of time exceeding 90 days, the payroll deductions authorized by such subsections, respectively, shall be discontinued for the delinquent organization until costs reimbursements have been paid up-to-date.

- 8 (<u>lg</u>) Deductions for the payment of monthly and quarterly parking 9 permits in City-owned/operated parking facilities and non-city-10 owned/operated parking facilities providing parking to not less 11 than 25 employees of any one or more agencies of the City for 12 the purpose of providing parking to such employees during their 13 City working hours.
 - (mh) Deductions for City-authorized wellness programs.

15 (n) Deductions for the purchase or payment of monthly and/or quarterly permits and/or fees in JEA owned/operated facilities.
17 (o) Deductions for voluntary contributions to the Police Athletic League.

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(pi) Deductions for voluntary contributions to the Police Death
Benefit.

21 (\underline{qj}) Deductions for dues to the Retired Employees Association. 22 (\underline{rk}) Deductions for voluntary contributions to the Firefighter 23 Benefits Fund.

- 24 (<u>sl</u>) Deductions for voluntary contributions to the Concerns of 25 Police Survivorsexisting police charities.
- 26 (tm) Deductions for voluntary contributions to Officer Kris
 27 Kringle, Inc. At least 100 City employees must contribute to
 28 Officer Kris Kringle, Inc. within six (6) months after the
 29 effective date of this ordinance and thereafter, or the payroll
 30 deduction authorized by this Section shall be discontinued<u>United</u>
 31 Way.

1 Section 2. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the 2 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 3 division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 4 herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary to make the 5 Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are 6 approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code 7 shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

8 Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 9 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 10 without the Mayor's signature.
