5 A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING MR. DEWITT
6 COOPER, III, FOR HIS OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS
7 TO THE ARTS, EDUCATION, AND THE JACKSONVILLE
8 COMMUNITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

10 **WHEREAS**, Mr. DeWitt Cooper, III, is an internationally acclaimed
11 performer, teacher, mentor, and motivator whose passion for the arts
12 has uplifted generations of young people in Jacksonville and beyond;
13 and

14 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper began his teaching career at Brentwood
15 Elementary School, where he inspired young men to rise above
16 insecurity and discover their place in the world, one of whom has
17 gone on to become the face of the Memphis Ballet; and

18 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper currently serves as a Professor of Theater
19 and Dance at Morgan State University, while remaining deeply connected
20 to Jacksonville through his role as Artist-in-Residence for LaVilla
21 School of the Arts and Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, where he
22 teaches Musical Theatre Styles and Physical Theatre; and

23 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper is the Co-Founding Artistic Director of the
24 CooperMorgan Dance Theatre, alongside noted dance empresario Savery
25 Morgan, a creative partnership that has brought innovation,
26 collaboration, and global recognition to the Jacksonville arts
27 community; and

28 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper's leadership and dedication have
29 consistently elevated arts education in Jacksonville, with many of
30 his students advancing to prestigious arts colleges and thriving as
31 professional artists across the world; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper's has extended his impact far beyond the
2 classroom, volunteering for six years with Beaches Fine Arts to bring
3 free world-class performances to the public, and previously serving
4 as Artistic Director of both the Jacksonville Center for the Arts and
5 The Posh Factory; and

6 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper's academic journey reflects both discipline
7 and distinction, having attended Florida State University as a JMI
8 Scholar, and later Case Western Reserve University, where he earned
9 his Master of Fine Arts in Contemporary Dance with full scholarship
10 and stipend, becoming the first African American male to graduate
11 with this terminal degree; and

12 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper's professional excellence has been
13 consistently recognized, including the 2017 Pelican Award for Best
14 Choreography for *In the Heights*, induction into the 2018 Leadership
15 Accelerator Program sponsored by Chase Bank, recognition as 2021
16 Adjunct Teacher of the Year, and being named 2023 Teacher of the Week
17 by First Coast News; and

18 **WHEREAS**, in 2019, Mr. Cooper was appointed sponsor and Director
19 of Black Arts at Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, where he founded
20 the groundbreaking red-carpet showcase *A.L.I.V.E.* and launched the
21 Legacy Project to commission a bronze statue of Douglas Anderson,
22 ensuring a permanent monument to Black history and artistic legacy
23 in Jacksonville; and

24 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Cooper's influence as a performer, teacher, and
25 choreographer has reached global audiences, gracing classrooms and
26 stages in the United States, Europe, Canada, Japan, China, and Taiwan,
27 while simultaneously mentoring young artists who now thrive
28 professionally on stages around the world; now therefore

29 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

30 **Section 1.** The City Council hereby honors and commends Mr.
31 DeWitt Cooper, III, for his extraordinary contributions to the arts,

1 education, and the enrichment of Jacksonville's cultural life.

2 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
3 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
4 without the Mayor's signature.
