AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,500,000.00 FROM THE MOBILITY FEE - ZONE 9 PROJECT TO THE MONCRIEF ROAD BEAUTIFICATION (34TH - 45TH STREET) PROJECT (THE "PROJECT") TO FUND DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS RELATED TO THE PROJECT, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 25-022; AMENDING THE 2025-2029 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2024-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO THE PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$2,500,000.00 from the Mobility Fee - Zone 9 Project to the Moncrief Road

Beautification (34th - 45th Street) project to provide funding for the design and construction of intersection improvements including vehicular and pedestrian signal upgrades, new concrete sidewalk, curb and gutters, pedestrian overpass aesthetics, landscape renovations and enhancements along the corridor (the "Project").

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the design and construction of the Project, to provide a safer environment for traffic, pedestrians and bicyclists. The reconditioning of the pedestrian overpass and landscaping enhancements will create green appeal and reestablish an attractiveness to the area.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2024-505-E, adopting the 2025-2029 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reflect the appropriation of funds to the Project, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay the completion of the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2024-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2024-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Oversight. The Engineering and Construction

Management Division of the Department of Public Works shall provide

oversight for the project described herein. 2 Section 5. Effective Date.
