Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. When asked, Ms. Carraher said there is approximately \$828,000 in the Environmental Protection Fund prior to this legislation.

Mr. Richardson, EPB, talked about the necessity for a county wide vulnerability assessment, and how the assessment makes the city eligible for additional resiliency funding.

There was some discussion on this bill related to the need for the assessment, methodology, funding, redundancy, the role of JEA, the direct contract with UF Center for Coastal Solutions, and possible methods by which to assist those with failing septic tanks.

Dr. Tricia Kyzar, UF, spoke about the methodology and the scoring of vulnerabilities.

Mr. Richardson talked about permissible uses for the EP fund.
