AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY COUNCIL'S 1-YEAR

STRATEGIC PLAN; SETTING THE CITY COUNCIL'S TOP

BUDGET PRIORITIES FOR THE 2024-2025 FISCAL YEAR;

ENCOURAGING THE MAYOR TO INCORPORATE THE COUNCIL

PRIORITIES INTO THE 2024-2025 BUDGET; WAIVING

THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 106.110 (CITY COUNCIL

STRATEGIC PLAN), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS),

STRATEGIC PLAN WITH CORRESPONDING FUNDING

REQUESTS TO CITY ADMINISTRATION NO LATER THAN

ORDINANCE CODE, REQUIRING SUBMITTAL OF

FEBRUARY 15TH; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(BUDGET AND ACCOUNTING CODE),

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WHEREAS, in accordance with the requirements of Section 106.110, Ordinance Code, the Council is required to update and adopt its strategic plan annually; and

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WHEREAS, the Council adopted prior 1, 3, and 5 year strategic by Resolutions 2018-594-A, 2020-34-A, 2021-364-A, 2021-893-A and Ordinance 2023-149-E; and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2024, the Finance Committee conducted an initial strategic planning meeting for fiscal year 2024-2025 to continue the process of developing both a short-term and long-term vision to guide the actions of City Council; and

WHEREAS, in preparation for the meeting, City Council Members were asked to consider setting aside a large portion of the available strategic planning dollars for fiscal year 2024-2025 into a reserve account to offset debt service for significant capital projects anticipated to occur within the next three years and to propose smaller, short-term strategic initiatives to be considered by the Council as priorities for the various Council Districts covering a 1-year time frame; and

WHEREAS, on February 21, 2024, the Finance Committee held a final strategic planning meeting where the Committee determined it appropriate to recommend the Council set aside \$5,000,000 in the Stadium (Strategic Downtown Project) Reserve account in preparation for anticipated significant capital projects in the Downtown over the next several years, and further developed the final list of 1-year strategic plan goals along with funding requests corresponding to those goals for submittal to City Administration for inclusion in the fiscal year 2024-2025 budget; and

WHEREAS, this strategic plan does not bind future City Council bodies but is intended to develop a shared sense of priorities and direction with the goal of supporting and investing in the vision for the future of the city that these priorities embody; and

WHEREAS, it is also the intention of City Council to communicate its budgetary priorities to the Administration so that these areas may be considered during the budget building process; and

WHEREAS, it is the Council's desire that these areas be considered for additional investment to the extent that revenues exceed expenses after taking into account mandatory cost increases, inflation, those budgetary targets and requirements set forth in the municipal code and other critical needs as determined during the budget review and preparation process; and

WHEREAS, to the extent practicable, the Council requests the recurring costs referenced in the below priority areas be considered by the Administration for funding without the use of one-time reserves; now therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Adoption of the Strategic Plan. The City Council hereby adopts its strategic plan as follows:

Long-term Strategic Priority (2024-2025):

• Allocate funding to the Stadium (Strategic Downtown Project)

Reserve to offset future debt service for Downtown projects

(\$5,000,000).

1-year goals (2024-2025) (short-term initiatives):

- Provide funding to support opportunities and initiatives to combat homelessness and promote development of affordable housing:
 - o Appropriate \$150,000 to Trinity Rescue Mission to provide transportation to homeless individuals seeking to obtain and sustain employment;
 - o Appropriate \$125,000 to Habitat for Humanity of Jacksonville for development of affordable housing in Council District 14;
- Provide funding to support and provide access to food and basic necessities:
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to Feeding Northeast Florida to support expansion of its food pantry cold storage and warehouse space;
 - o Appropriate \$100,000 to Safe Future Foundation, Inc. to support its mobile food pantry, diaper bank and period bank.
- Provide funding to support and promote education and training programs:
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to LIFT JAX for expansion of the Workforce Education and Training Center at Debs Grocery Store on Jacksonville's Eastside;
- Provide funding to support programs and services targeting

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various underserved Duval County populations and residents:

- o Appropriate \$50,000 to Ben's Place to provide day programs to adult Duval County students with disabilities;
- o Appropriate \$200,000 to Northside Community Involvement,
 Inc. to provide resources and programs to support
 low-income families and children in Duval County;
- o Appropriate \$100,000 to Isaiah 117 House to provide services and programs for children awaiting foster care placement;
- o Appropriate \$100,000 to the Northeast Florida Immigrant Resource Alliance for the provision of services to Duval County's immigrant population;
- o Appropriate \$100,000 to Treasure House, Inc. for the provision of services for families with neurodivergent children and children with disabilities;
- o Establish a Police Athletic League in the Valencia Way housing complex to work with area youth and to initiate services and programs to combat crime (\$200,000);
- o Provide funding for grants to various Community Development Corporations to support economic development through the provision of services and programs aimed at improving access to affordable housing, social services, education and safety workshops, cultural development and youth programs (\$100,000);
- Provide funding to support and provide additional resources to the City's veteran community:
 - o Appropriate \$100,000 for upgrades to the UNF Military and Veterans Resource Center;
 - o Appropriate \$265,657 to construct a rain/shade structure adjacent to the Veterans Memorial Wall;
- Appropriate \$200,000 to the City of Atlantic Beach to assist

with construction of a lifeguard station;

- Provide funding to support programs that encourage and promote individual and familial health and healthy lifestyles:
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to support organizations that provide programs and services aimed at addressing health disparities in Jacksonville's Southside and in other underserved communities in Duval County;
 - o Appropriate \$100,000 to Edward Waters University to provide certified personnel and expanded hours of operation for the Samuel Newby Community Athletic Center;
- Provide funding to reduce blight and to support neighborhood development and beautification:
 - o Establish a community grant program to support the City's various registered neighborhood associations to complete projects designed to combat blight and beautify/rehabilitate neighborhoods (\$100,000);
 - o Provide funding to strengthen the Public Works Department's
 ability to conduct Countywide tree trimming and median
 maintenance/beautification (\$100,000);
 - o Provide funding to strengthen the Public Works Department's
 ability to complete Countywide ditch service and
 maintenance (\$100,000);
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to the Mandarin Community Club to provide various programs and services including preservation and restoration of Mandarin's historic properties, neighborhood beautification projects, development of various educational programs and forums,

etc.;

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- Facilitate and promote the growth and sustainability of small businesses:
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to provide additional support for the Moncrief Area Business Improvement Program (proposed to be expanded and renamed the "Myrle-Moncrief-Soutel Business Corridor");
- Provide funding for improvements to City parks and certain associated facilities:
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to provide supplemental funding for District 5 park improvements and enhancements approved by the Special Committee on Parks and Quality of Life;
 - o Appropriate \$200,000 to construct a storage facility at San Mateo Little League Park and to procure additional field materials for baseball and softball programs at the Park.
- Priorities of City Council. The Council has Section 2. deliberated and debated its top priorities for fiscal year 2024-2025 and hereby submits the long-term and short-term strategic priorities of the City Council as outlined in Section 1 above.
- Section 3. Encouraging the Mayor to Incorporate Council Priorities into the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget. The Council hereby requests and encourages the Mayor to incorporate the Council strategic priorities into the fiscal year 2024-2025 budget for the consolidated government of the City of Jacksonville.
- Section 4. Waiver of Section 106.110 (City Strategic Plan), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 106.110 (City Council Strategic Plan), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 106 (Budget and Accounting Code), Ordinance Code, requiring the City Council to forward the funding requests for each component of the

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strategic plan to City Administration no later than February 15th are

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
