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## ORDINANCE 2025-679-E

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING ADMINISTRATIVE DEVIATION APPLICATION AD-25-57, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 7 AT 2917 ALGONQUIN AVENUE, BETWEEN BALTIC STREET AND VERONA AVENUE (R.E. NO(S). 101798-0000), AS DESCRIBED HEREIN, OWNED BY DAVID P. AND KATHERINE C. HAGER, AS TRUSTEES OF THE HAGER TRUST, A REVOCABLE LIVING TRUST, REQUESTING TO 1) REDUCE THE REQUIRED MINIMUM LOT AREA FROM 9,900 SQUARE FEET TO 7,500 SQUARE FEET, 2) REDUCE THE SIDE YARD SETBACK FOR AN ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT FROM 5 FEET TO 4 FEET, 3) REDUCE THE REAR YARD SETBACK FOR AN ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT FROM 10 FEET TO 7 FEET, 4) REDUCE THE REQUIRED LOT WIDTH FROM 90 FEET TO 50 FEET, IN ZONING DISTRICT RESIDENTIAL LOW DENSITY-90 (RLD-90), AS DEFINED AND CLASSIFIED UNDER THE ZONING CODE; ADOPTING RECOMMENDED FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THELAND USE AND COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR DISTRIBUTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, an application for an administrative deviation, Revised On File with the City Council Legislative Services Division, was filed by Cyndy Trimmer, Esq., on behalf of the owner of property located in Council District 7 at 2917 Algonquin Avenue, between Baltic Street and Verona Avenue (R.E. No(s). 101798-0000) (the "Subject Property"), requesting to 1) reduce the required minimum lot area

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from 9,900 square feet to 7,500 square feet, 2) reduce the side yard setback for an accessory dwelling unit from 5 feet to 4 feet, 3) reduce the rear yard setback for an accessory dwelling unit from 10 feet to 7 feet, 4) reduce the required lot width from 90 feet to 50 feet, in Zoning District Residential Low Density-90 (RLD-90); and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department has considered the application and all attachments thereto and has rendered an advisory recommendation; and

WHEREAS, the Land Use and Zoning Committee, after due notice held a public hearing and having duly considered both the testimonial and documentary evidence presented at the public hearing, has made its recommendation to the Council; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Adoption of Findings and Conclusions. Section 1. Council has considered the recommendation of the Land Use and Zoning Committee and reviewed the Staff Report of the Planning and Development Department concerning administrative deviation Application AD-25-57, which requests to 1) reduce the required minimum lot area from 9,900 square feet to 7,500 square feet, 2) reduce the side yard setback for an accessory dwelling unit from 5 feet to 4 feet, 3) reduce the rear yard setback for an accessory dwelling unit from 10 feet to 7 feet 4) reduce the required lot width from 90 feet to 50 feet. Based upon the competent, substantial evidence contained in the record, the Council hereby determines that the requested administrative deviation meets each of the following criteria required to grant the request pursuant to Section 656.109(h), Ordinance Code, as specifically identified in the Staff Report of the Planning and Development Department:

- (1) There are practical or economic difficulties in carrying out the strict letter of the regulation;
  - (2) The request is not based exclusively upon a desire to reduce

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the cost of developing the site, but would accomplish some result that is in the public interest, such as, for example, furthering the preservation of natural resources by saving a tree or trees;

- (3) The proposed deviation will not substantially diminish property values in, nor alter the essential character of, the area surrounding the site and will not substantially interfere with or injure the rights of others whose property would be affected by the deviation;
- (4) The proposed deviation will not be detrimental to the public health, safety or welfare, result in additional public expense, the creation of nuisances, or conflict with any other applicable law;
- (5) The proposed deviation has been recommended by a City landscape architect, if the deviation is to reduce required landscaping; and
- (6) The effect of the proposed deviation is in harmony with the spirit and intent of the Zoning Code.

Therefore, administrative deviation Application AD-25-57 hereby approved.

Section 2. Owner and Description. The Subject Property is owned by David P. and Katherine C. Hager, as Trustees of the Hager Trust, a revocable living trust, and is legally described in Exhibit 1, dated July 8, 2025, and graphically depicted in Revised Exhibit 2, both of which are attached hereto.
