Eckart, LLC is a distributor of electrical, plumbing and HVAC equipment and supplies seeking to establish a regional distribution facility in Jacksonville, Florida to serve the Southeast United States. The company's headquarters is located Corydon, Indiana and presently employs 385 people. Eckart proposes leasing a vacant 150,000 SF warehouse located at 5400 W 12 th Street. The location is within a Level 1 Economically Distressed Area in the Northwest area of Jacksonville. The building, constructed in 1986, is situated on a 7.3-acre tract, zoned Light Industrial. Eckart is a targeted industry business within the Logistics and Distribution, paying above average wages. The company proposes to create at least 45 new full-time jobs within 36 months after taking occupancy of the building. The average wage of the jobs being created is \$79,960 plus benefits, which is 121% above the \$65,961 Duval County average wage. The company estimates a private capital investment of \$1,000,000 within the first 24 months of occupancy. The initial investment in year one is \$500,000, with an additional \$500,000 in year two. Eckart has indicated that the proposed Local Targeted Industry Employment Grant (TI Grant) is a material factor in locating their business in Jacksonville. The proposed TI Grant is \$1,500 for each new full-time job created within the first 36 months of operation, for a maximum of 45 jobs, or \$67,500. This proposed incentive is consistent with the Public Investment Policy (PIP) Guidelines for the program specified.
