AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, A TRANSFER AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT), PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF A 2.72± ACRE PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY (R.E. NO. 132045-0000) (THE "PROPERTY") FDOT TO THE CITY, FOR NO CONSIDERATION, AS AN ADDITION TO HENRY L. BROWN-KOOKER PARK, AND PROVIDING FOR CITY RESPONSIBILITY FOR OWNERSHIP, OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF THE PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the State of Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") acquired and owns a 2.72± acre parcel of real property at 21st Street and Bennett Street, which was formerly a portion of the existing Henry L. Brown-Kooker Park, and upon which FDOT has since constructed a parking lot (R.E. No. 132045-0000) (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, FDOT desires to transfer the Property to the City, and City desires to acquire such Property, for no consideration, as an addition to Henry L. Brown-Kooker Park, and to assume the ownership, operation, maintenance, and repair obligations thereof,

subject to the terms of the Transfer and Maintenance Agreement described herein; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Transfer and Maintenance Agreement Approval and Section 1. Authorization to Execute. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City of Jacksonville, the Transfer and Maintenance Agreement between The State of Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT") and the City of Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida (the "Agreement"), in substantially the same form attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and any ancillary or related documents or resolutions as may be required to effectuate the transfer of the Property and related maintenance obligations to the City. The Agreement authorizes the transfer of the Property and improvements thereon from FDOT to the City, for no consideration, via map transfer or any other means of conveyance as allowed by law, including by a Public Purpose Quitclaim Deed attached hereto as Exhibit 2, with the contingency that the Property remain open for public use. In addition, the Agreement transfers the responsibility for the operation, maintenance, and repair of the Property from the FDOT to City. Upon completion of the transfer, the City shall own, operate, maintain, and repair the Property and all improvements thereon at its sole expense. Should the Property cease to be used for a public purpose, ownership will revert to FDOT.

Section 2. Oversight Department. The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department shall oversee administration of the Agreement described herein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

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
