RESOLUTION 2022-134-A

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND Α SUPPORTING RESOLUTION 2022-01, AS ADOPTED ΒY THE JACKSONVILLE WATERWAYS COMMISSION, REQUESTING THAT THE CITY PETITION THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS ("USACE") TO UNDERTAKE A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE CAUSE AND SOLUTION FOR A SANDBAR/SHOAL FORMED IN THE ST. JOHNS RIVER, ADJACENT TO THE FULTON CUT AND BLOUNT ISLAND; REQUESTING THE MAYOR EXECUTE AND DELIVER A WRITTEN LETTER TO THE USACE FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in the natural section of the St. Johns River that is adjacent to the "Fulton Cut" and Blount Island, a sandbar or shoal ("shoal") has developed; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission is committed to the protection of Jacksonville waterways and the citizens of Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, the shoal was not present ten (10) years ago, but has formed and is rapidly increasing in size and now encompasses approximately 7 to 10 football fields in length and about 1 football field in width; and

WHEREAS, at low tide, the depth of the water is only 1.5 to 2 feet and presents a great safety risk to people and watercraft; and WHEREAS, pursuant to discussions with the USACE staff, in order 7

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to obtain assistance from the USACE with this matter, the City is required to make a written request, via the Mayor of the City of Jacksonville or designee, to the USACE to determine if the USACE has the authority or jurisdiction to conduct a study to determine the cause of the formation of the shoal and to plan a strategy for its removal and prevention of future formation; and

WHEREAS, the USACE staff has advised that a study of similar magnitude would cost approximately \$3,000,000, and the USACE would be expecting the City to sponsor the study and provide \$1,500,000 of that cost; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Waterways Commission, at its regularly scheduled meeting on February 9, 2022 passed a Resolution, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, stating its support for the City to request the USACE to undertake the study as outlined; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Requesting the Mayor Execute and forward a written request to the USACE regarding a shoal in the St. Johns River. The Mayor, or his designee, is hereby requested to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, a written request to the USACE regarding the shoaling that has taken place in the St. Johns River adjacent to the Fulton Cut and Blount Island. The written request, which will be drafted by the Office of General Counsel, will set forth the following: (1) identify the location of the shoal; (2) provide a timeline or history of its creation and request that the USACE proceed to determine if they have jurisdiction over this type of issue; (3) ask the USACE for authority to conduct a study regarding the cause and the solution for removal and prevention of future shoaling in that location; and (4) acknowledge that the City will be a financial partner with the USACE in that study.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
